A bill to be entitled
An act relating to the transportation disadvantaged; amending s. 427.012, F.S.; revising the composition of the board of the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged; providing for 15 board members with nine members appointed by the Governor; providing for a member to be appointed to a term of 4 years and limiting the member to two terms; providing criteria for membership on the commission relating to contracts and benefits; providing for filling a vacancy; prohibiting a member from serving more than 2 years as chairperson of the commission; requiring each member to represent the needs of the transportation disadvantaged throughout the state and not subordinate the needs of the transportation disadvantaged in general to favor the needs of others residing in a specific location in the state; authorizing the commission to appoint technical advisory committees; providing for the membership and duties of the technical advisory committees; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 427.012, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
427.012 The Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged.--There is created the Commission for the 1

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Transportation Disadvantaged in the Department of Transportation.
(1) The commission shall consist of 15 the following members:
(a) The Secretary of the Department of Transportation or the secretary's designee.
(b) The Secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services or the secretary's designee.
(e) The Commissioner of Education or the eommissionex's designee.
(d) The secretary of the Department of Labor and

Employment seeurity or the secretary's designee.
(e) The executive director of the Department of

Veterans' Affairs or the exeeutive director's designee.
(c)(f) The Secretary of the Department of Elderly Affairs or the secretary's designee.
(d) (g) The Secretary director of the Ageney for Health Care Administration or the secretary's dires designee.
(e)(h) A representative of the Florida Association of Coordinated Transportation for Community Action, who shall serve at the pleasure of that association.
(f)(i) A representative of the Florida Public Transit Association, who shall serve at the pleasure of that association.
(g) (j) A person over the age of 60 who uses paratransit services. This is a member of a reegnized statewide organization representing elderly Floridians. Sueh person shall be appointed by the Governor to represent elderly Floridians and shall be appointed to serve a term of 4 years.
(h) (k) A handicapped person who uses paratransit services. This is a member of a reeognized statewide

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Organization representing handicapped Floridians. Sueh person
shall be appointed by the Governor to represent handicapped
Floridians and shall be appointed to sexve a term of 4 years.
    (i) Seven members appointed by the Governor. The
Governor shall appoint one member from each of the seven
districts of the Department of Transportation. Each member is
subject to confirmation by the senate. The appointed member
must be a local elected official.
    (1) Two eitizen advocate representatives who shall be
appointed by the Governox for a texm of 4 years, one
representing rural eitizens and one representing urban
eitizens-
    (m) A representative of the community transportation
eoordinators. Such person shall be appointed by the Governox
to represent all community transportation coordinators and
shall be appointed to sexve a texm-of 4 yearse
    (n) One member of the Early Childhood Council. Sueh
person shall be appointed by the Governox to represent
maternal and child health care providers and shall be
appointed to serve a term of 4 years.
    (0) Two representatives of eurrent private for profit
or private not for profit tramsportation operators each of
which have a minimum of 5 years of continuous experienee
operating a broad based system of ambulatory and
wheelchair/stretcher type transportation, utilizing not less
than 50 vehieles and ineluding dispateh and seheduling
responsibilities. Such pexsons shall be appointed by the
Commissioner of Agrieulture to serve a term of 4 years.
    (p) Four representatives of eurrent private for profit
0x private not for profit tramsportation operators, each of
which having a minimum of 5 years of continuous experience
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operating a broad based system of ambulatory and wheelehair or
streteher type transportation, utiliming not less than 50
vehicles, and including dispateh and seheduling
responsibilities. Sueh persons shall be appointed by the
Commissioner of Agriculture to serve a term of 4 years.
    (g) Six eitizens representing the nontransportation
business community of the state, three members appointed by
the president of the Senate and three members appointed by the
Speaker of the House of Representatives.
    (2) Members appointed to the commission shall be
appointed to terms of 4 years each and a member may not serve
more than two full terms. A member must be a citizen of the
state and a registered voter. A member, other than a local
elected official, may not be an emplovee or agent of a
community transportation coordinator, a contractor or
subcontractor of a community transportation coordinator, or a
direct or indirect subcontractor to a contractor employed by a
community transportation coordinator.
    (3) A member, other than a local elected official, may
not have any interest, direct or indirect, in any contract,
franchise, privilege, or other benefit granted or awarded by
the commission, the Agency for Health Care Administration, or
the Department of Children and Family Services during the term
of his or her appointment and for 2 vears after the
termination of the appointment. Each appointed member must
undergo a background screening in accordance with the level 2
standards for screening set forth in chapter 435.
    (4) Vacancies in the membership of the commission
shall be filled in the same manner as the original
appointment. However, if a vacancy remains unfilled for more
than 45 days, the Governor may fill the vacant position.
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(5)(2) The chairperson and vice chairperson of the commission shall be elected annually from the membership of the commission. A member may not serve more than 2 years as chairperson of the commission.
(6)(3) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but shall be allowed per diem and travel expenses, as provided in s. 112.061.
(7)(4) The commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the call of the chairperson. Nine members of the commission constitute a quorum, and a majority vote of the members present is necessary for any action taken by the commission.
(8)(5) The Governor may remove any member of the commission for cause.
(9)(6) The commission shall appoint an executive director who shall serve under the direction, supervision, and control of the commission. The executive director, with the consent of the commission, shall employ such personnel as may be necessary to perform adequately the functions of the commission within budgetary limitations. All employees of the commission are exempt from the Career Service System.
(10) Each member of the commission must represent the needs of the transportation disadvantaged throughout the state. A member may not subordinate the needs of the transportation disadvantaged in general to favor the needs of others residing in a specific location in the state.
(11)(7) The commission is assigned to the office of the secretary of the Department of Transportation for administrative and fiscal accountability purposes, but it shall otherwise function independently of the control, supervision, and direction of the department.

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> (12)(8) The commission shall develop a budget under chapter 216. The budget is not subject to change by the department staff after it has been approved by the commission, but it shall be transmitted to the Governor, as head of the department, along with the budget of the department.
> (13) The commission may appoint technical advisory committees to advise the commission on issues of importance to the state and to regions of the state. A technical advisory committee shall provide information, advice, and direction to the commission on the coordination of services for the transportation disadvantaged. The commission may establish the size, composition, and focus of each committee created, which shall include, but not be limited to, a committee on private provider transportation operators. A member appointed to a technical advisory committee shall serve without compensation and is not entitled to per diem or travel expenses.
