1 Transportation Disadvantaged in the Department of 2 Transportation. (1) The commission shall consist of 15 the following 3 4 members: 5 (a) The Secretary of the Department of Transportation 6 or the secretary's designee. 7 (b) The Secretary of the Department of Children and 8 Family Services or the secretary's designee. (c) The Commissioner of Education or the 9 10 commissioner's designee. 11 (d) The secretary of the Department of Labor and 12 Employment Security or the secretary's designee. 13 (e) The executive director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs or the executive director's designee. 14 (c)(f) The Secretary of the Department of Elderly 15 Affairs or the secretary's designee. 16 17 (d)(g) The <u>Secretary</u> director of the Agency for Health Care Administration or the secretary's director's designee. 18 (e)(h) A representative of the Florida Association of 19 20 Coordinated Transportation for Community Action, who shall 21 serve at the pleasure of that association. 22 (f)(i) A representative of the Florida Public Transit 23 Association, who shall serve at the pleasure of that 2.4 association. 25 (q)(j) A person over the age of 60 who uses paratransit services. This is a member of a recognized 26 27 statewide organization representing elderly Floridians. Such 2.8 person shall be appointed by the Governor to represent elderly Floridians and shall be appointed to serve a term of 4 years. 29 30 (h) (k) A handicapped person who uses paratransit services. This is a member of a recognized statewide 31

organization representing handicapped Floridians. Such person 1 2 shall be appointed by the Governor to represent handicapped Floridians and shall be appointed to serve a term of 4 years. 3 4 (i) Seven members appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall appoint one member from each of the seven 5 б districts of the Department of Transportation. Each member is 7 subject to confirmation by the Senate. The appointed member must be a local elected official. 8 9 (1) Two citizen advocate representatives who shall be 10 appointed by the Governor for a term of 4 years, one representing rural citizens and one representing urban 11 12 citizens. 13 (m) A representative of the community transportation coordinators. Such person shall be appointed by the Governor 14 to represent all community transportation coordinators and 15 16 shall be appointed to serve a term of 4 years. 17 (n) One member of the Early Childhood Council. Such 18 person shall be appointed by the Governor to represent maternal and child health care providers and shall be 19 2.0 appointed to serve a term of 4 years. 21 (o) Two representatives of current private for profit 2.2 or private not for profit transportation operators each of 23 which have a minimum of 5 years of continuous experience 2.4 operating a broad based system of ambulatory and 25 wheelchair/stretcher type transportation, utilizing not less than 50 vehicles and including dispatch and scheduling 26 27 responsibilities. Such persons shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture to serve a term of 4 years. 2.8 29 (p) Four representatives of current private for profit 30 or private not for profit transportation operators, each of which having a minimum of 5 years of continuous experience 31

1 operating a broad based system of ambulatory and wheelchair or 2 stretcher type transportation, utilizing not less than 50 vehicles, and including dispatch and scheduling 3 4 responsibilities. Such persons shall be appointed by the 5 Commissioner of Agriculture to serve a term of 4 years. б (q) Six citizens representing the nontransportation 7 business community of the state, three members appointed by the President of the Senate and three members appointed by the 8 9 Speaker of the House of Representatives. 10 (2) Members appointed to the commission shall be appointed to terms of 4 years each and a member may not serve 11 more than two full terms. A member must be a citizen of the 12 state and a registered voter. A member, other than a local 13 elected official, may not be an employee or agent of a 14 community transportation coordinator, a contractor or 15 subcontractor of a community transportation coordinator, or a 16 17 direct or indirect subcontractor to a contractor employed by a 18 community transportation coordinator. 19 (3) A member, other than a local elected official, may not have any interest, direct or indirect, in any contract, 20 21 franchise, privilege, or other benefit granted or awarded by 2.2 the commission, the Agency for Health Care Administration, or 23 the Department of Children and Family Services during the term of his or her appointment and for 2 years after the 2.4 termination of the appointment. Each appointed member must 25 undergo a background screening in accordance with the level 2 26 27 standards for screening set forth in chapter 435. 2.8 (4) Vacancies in the membership of the commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original 29 appointment. However, if a vacancy remains unfilled for more 30 than 45 days, the Governor may fill the vacant position. 31

1 (5) (2) The chairperson and vice chairperson of the 2 commission shall be elected annually from the membership of the commission. A member may not serve more than 2 years as 3 chairperson of the commission. 4 (6) (6) (3) Members of the commission shall serve without 5 б compensation but shall be allowed per diem and travel 7 expenses, as provided in s. 112.061. 8 (7) (4) The commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the call of the chairperson. Nine 9 members of the commission constitute a quorum, and a majority 10 vote of the members present is necessary for any action taken 11 12 by the commission. 13 (8) (5) The Governor may remove any member of the commission for cause. 14 (9)(6) The commission shall appoint an executive 15 director who shall serve under the direction, supervision, and 16 17 control of the commission. The executive director, with the 18 consent of the commission, shall employ such personnel as may be necessary to perform adequately the functions of the 19 commission within budgetary limitations. All employees of the 20 21 commission are exempt from the Career Service System. 22 (10) Each member of the commission must represent the 23 needs of the transportation disadvantaged throughout the state. A member may not subordinate the needs of the 2.4 transportation disadvantaged in general to favor the needs of 25 26 others residing in a specific location in the state. 27 (11) (1) (7) The commission is assigned to the office of 2.8 the secretary of the Department of Transportation for administrative and fiscal accountability purposes, but it 29 shall otherwise function independently of the control, 30 supervision, and direction of the department. 31

1	(12) (8) The commission shall develop a budget <u>under</u>
2	pursuant to chapter 216. The budget is not subject to change
3	by the department staff after it has been approved by the
4	commission, but it shall be transmitted to the Governor, as
5	head of the department, along with the budget of the
6	department.
7	(13) The commission may appoint technical advisory
8	committees to advise the commission on issues of importance to
9	the state and to regions of the state. A technical advisory
10	committee shall provide information, advice, and direction to
11	the commission on the coordination of services for the
12	transportation disadvantaged. The commission may establish the
13	size, composition, and focus of each committee created, which
14	shall include, but not be limited to, a committee on private
15	provider transportation operators. A member appointed to a
16	technical advisory committee shall serve without compensation
17	and is not entitled to per diem or travel expenses.
18	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.

22	Revises the composition of the board of the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged. Provides
23	limitations on years of service. Provides criteria for membership on the commission relating to contracts and
24	benefits. Provides for the filling of a vacancy. Requires each member to represent the needs of the transportation
25	disadvantaged throughout the state and not subordinate the needs of the transportation disadvantaged in general
26	to favor the needs of others residing in a specific location in the state. Authorizes the commission to
27	appoint technical advisory committees. Provides for membership and duties of the technical advisory
28	committees.
