2 An act relating to hospice facilities; amending s. 553.73, F.S.; including hospice facilities within the purview of 3 4 the Florida Building Code; amending s. 400.605, F.S.; deleting provisions requiring the Department of Elderly 5 Affairs to adopt physical plant standards for hospice 6 facilities; creating s. 400.6051, F.S.; requiring that 7 construction standards for hospice facilities be in 8 9 compliance with the Florida Building Code; requiring the 10 Agency for Health Care Administration to provide technical assistance to the Florida Building Commission to update the 11 Florida Building Code for hospice facilities; providing an 12 effective date. 13 14 15 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 16 17 Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 553.73, Florida 18 Statutes, is amended to read: 19 553.73 Florida Building Code.--The Florida Building Code shall contain provisions or 20 (2)requirements for public and private buildings, structures, and 21 facilities relative to structural, mechanical, electrical, 22 plumbing, energy, and gas systems, existing buildings, 23 24 historical buildings, manufactured buildings, elevators, coastal 25 construction, lodging facilities, food sales and food service facilities, health care facilities, including assisted living 26 27 facilities, adult day care facilities, hospice residential and inpatient facilities and units, and facilities for the control 28 29 of radiation hazards, public or private educational facilities, Page 1 of 4

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30 swimming pools, and correctional facilities and enforcement of 31 and compliance with such provisions or requirements. Further, the Florida Building Code must provide for uniform 32 implementation of ss. 515.25, 515.27, and 515.29 by including 33 standards and criteria for residential swimming pool barriers, 34 pool covers, latching devices, door and window exit alarms, and 35 other equipment required therein, which are consistent with the 36 intent of s. 515.23. Technical provisions to be contained within 37 the Florida Building Code are restricted to requirements related 38 39 to the types of materials used and construction methods and 40 standards employed in order to meet criteria specified in the Florida Building Code. Provisions relating to the personnel, 41 42 supervision or training of personnel, or any other professional qualification requirements relating to contractors or their 43 workforce may not be included within the Florida Building Code, 44 and subsections (4), (5), (6), and (7) are not to be construed 45 46 to allow the inclusion of such provisions within the Florida 47 Building Code by amendment. This restriction applies to both initial development and amendment of the Florida Building Code. 48

Statutes, is amended to read:

(1) The department, in consultation with the agency, shall
by rule establish minimum standards and procedures for a
hospice. The rules must include:

 (a) License application procedures and requirements.
 (b) The qualifications of professional and ancillary

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88	400.6051 Construction and renovation; requirementsThe
89	requirements for the construction and the renovation of a
90	hospice residential or inpatient facility or unit must comply
91	with the provisions of chapter 553 which pertain to building
92	construction standards, including plumbing, electrical code,
93	glass, manufactured buildings, accessibility for persons with
94	disabilities, and the state minimum building codes. The Agency
95	for Health Care Administration shall provide technical
96	assistance to the Florida Building Commission in updating the
97	construction standards of the Florida Building Code which govern
98	hospice facilities.
99	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.

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
