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Amendment No. (for drafter's use only) (2) As a condition of licensure, a business entity, as 16 defined in s. 112.312(5), with a material interest in a slot 17 machine gaming facility license may seek to influence the 18 19 governmental decisionmaking of a public officer or seek or encourage the passage, defeat, or modification of any proposal 20 or recommendation before such public officer. However, no such 21 22 business entity may engage a lobbyist as defined in s. 11.045 or 23 s. 112.3215, whether paid through contractual agreement or 24 salary or otherwise, to seek to influence the governmental 25 decisionmaking of a public officer or seek or encourage the 26 passage, defeat, or modification of any proposal or 27 recommendation before such public officer.
