Section 2. It is the finding of the Legislature that nonessential private information supplied by applicants pursuant to an application filed for the purpose of securing a license as a slot machine licensee and trade secrets supplied by any entity under chapter 551, Florida Statutes, for licensing purposes must be kept confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution in order to protect sensitive personal and financial information contained in applications filed with the Division of Slot Machines of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation and to protect confidential information about entities filing such applications.

Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date that HB 1901 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.
