 2 An act relating to public records; creating s. 551.1078,
 3 F.S.; providing an exemption from public records
 4 requirements for nonessential private information supplied
 5 by applicants pursuant to an application filed for the
 6 purpose of securing a license as a slot machine licensee
 7 and trade secrets supplied by any entity under ch. 551,
 8 F.S., for licensing purposes; providing for review and
 9 repeal; providing a statement of public necessity;
 10 providing a contingent effective date.

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 12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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 14 Section 1. Section 551.1078, Florida Statutes, is created
 15 to read:

16 551.1078 Public records exemption; nonessential private
 17 information of applicants for licensure; trade secrets.--

18 (1) Nonessential private information supplied by
 19 applicants pursuant to an application filed for the purpose of
 20 securing a license as a slot machine licensee and trade secrets
 21 supplied by any entity under this chapter for licensing purposes
 22 are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State
 23 Constitution.

24 (2) Subsection (1) is subject to the Open Government
 25 Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall
 26 stand repealed on October 2, 2010, unless reviewed and saved
 27 from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

28 Section 2. It is the finding of the Legislature that
29 nonessential private information supplied by applicants pursuant
30 to an application filed for the purpose of securing a license as
31 a slot machine licensee and trade secrets supplied by any entity
32 under chapter 551, Florida Statutes, for licensing purposes must
33 be kept confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a),
34 Art. I of the State Constitution in order to protect sensitive
35 personal and financial information contained in applications
36 filed with the Division of Slot Machines of the Department of
37 Business and Professional Regulation and to protect confidential
38 information about entities filing such applications.

39 Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date
40 that HB 1901 or similar legislation takes effect, if such
41 legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an
42 extension thereof and becomes law.
