Any optional 18 service that is provided shall be provided only when medically 19 necessary and in accordance with state and federal law. 20 Optional services rendered by providers in mobile units to 21 22 Medicaid recipients may be restricted or prohibited by the 23 agency. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent or limit the agency from adjusting fees, reimbursement rates, 2.4 lengths of stay, number of visits, or number of services, or 25 making any other adjustments necessary to comply with the 26 27 availability of moneys and any limitations or directions 2.8 provided for in the General Appropriations Act or chapter 216.
