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A bill to be entitled
An act relating to the Florida Hazardous
Materials Emergency Response and Community
Right-to-Know Act; updating a reference to a
federal list of hazardous substances for which
the Department of Community Affairs collects
fees that fund emergency planning and community
right-to-know programs; providing an effective
date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 252.85, Florida
Statutes, is amended to read:

252.85 Fees.--

(3) Any owner or operator of a facility that is
required to submit a report or filing under s. 313 of EPCRA
shall pay an annual reporting fee not to exceed \$150 for those
s. 313 EPCRA listed substances in effect on January 1, 2004
~~1998~~. The department shall establish by rule the date by which
the fee is to be paid, as well as a formula or method of
determining the applicable fee under this subsection.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
