Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 16 17 472.013, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 472.013 Examinations, prerequisites.--18 (2) An applicant shall be entitled to take the 19 licensure examination to practice in this state as a surveyor 20 21 and mapper if the applicant is of good moral character and has 22 satisfied one of the following requirements: 23 (b) The applicant is a graduate of a 4-year course of study, other than in surveying and mapping, at an accredited 24 college or university and has a specific experience record of 25 6 or more years as a subordinate to a registered surveyor and 26 27 mapper in the active practice of surveying and mapping, 5 2.8 years of which shall be of a nature indicating that the applicant was in responsible charge of the accuracy and 29 correctness of the surveying and mapping work performed. The 30 course of study in disciplines other than surveying and

mapping must have included not fewer than 32 semester hours of 2 study or its academic equivalent. The applicant must have completed a minimum of, 25 semester hours from a college or 3 university approved by the board of which shall be in 4 surveying and mapping subjects or in any combination of 5 courses in civil engineering, surveying, mapping, mathematics, 7 photogrammetry, forestry, or land law and the physical sciences. Any of the required 25 semester hours of study 8 completed not as a part of the 4-year course of study shall be 9 10 approved at the discretion of the board. Work experience acquired as a part of the education requirement shall not be 11 12 construed as experience in responsible charge. 13 Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section 472.015, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 14 472.015 Licensure.--15 (3)(a) The board shall certify as qualified for a 16 17 license by endorsement an applicant who: 1. Holds a valid license to practice surveying and 18 mapping issued prior to July 1, 1999, by another state or 19 territory of the United States; has passed a national, 20 21 regional, state, or territorial licensing examination that is 22 substantially equivalent to the examination required by s. 23 472.013; and has a specific experience record of at least 8 years as a subordinate to a registered surveyor and mapper in 2.4 the active practice of surveying and mapping, 6 years of which 25 26 must be of a nature indicating that the applicant was in 27 responsible charge of the accuracy and correctness of the 2.8 surveying and mapping work performed; or 29 2. Holds a valid license to practice surveying and mapping issued by another state or territory of the United 30

States if the criteria for issuance of the license were

substantially the same as the licensure criteria that existed 2 in Florida at the time the license was issued; or-3 3. Is a practicing photogrammetrist who holds the 4 Certified Photogrammetrist designation of the American Society 5 for Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing and held such designation on or before July 1, 2005; is a graduate of a 6 7 4-year course of study at an accredited college or university; 8 and has a specific experience record of 6 or more years as a subordinate to a Certified Photogrammetrist of the American 9 10 Society for Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing in the active practice of surveying and mapping, 5 years of which shall be 11 12 of a nature indicating that the applicant was in responsible 13 charge of the accuracy and correctness of the surveying and mapping work performed. The course of study must have included 14 not fewer than 32 semester hours of study or its academic 15 equivalent. The applicant must have completed a minimum of 25 16 semester hours from a college or university approved by the 18 board in surveying and mapping subjects or in any combination of courses in civil engineering, surveying, mapping, 19 mathematics, photogrammetry, forestry, or land law and the 2.0 21 physical sciences. Any of the required 25 semester hours of 2.2 study completed not as a part of the 4-year course of study 23 shall be approved at the discretion of the board. Work experience acquired as a part of the education requirement 2.4 shall not be construed as experience in responsible charge. 2.5 The applicant must have applied to the department for 26 2.7 licensure on or before July 1, 2007. 2.8 Section 3. Subsection (3) of section 472.021, Florida 29 Statutes, is amended to read: 30 472.021 Certification of partnerships and 31 corporations.--

1 (3) The fact that any registered surveyor and mapper 2 practices through a corporation or partnership shall not relieve the registrant from personal liability for negligence, 3 misconduct, or wrongful acts committed by him or her. 4 Partnerships and all partners shall be jointly and severally 5 6 liable for the negligence, misconduct, or wrongful acts 7 committed by their agents, employees, or partners while acting 8 in a professional capacity. Any officer, agent, or employee of a business organization other than a partnership shall be 9 10 personally liable and accountable only for negligent acts, wrongful acts, or misconduct committed by him or her or 11 12 committed by any person under his or her direct supervision 13 and control while rendering professional services on behalf of the business organization. The personal liability of a 14 shareholder or owner of a business organization, in his or her 15 capacity as shareholder or owner, shall be no greater than 16 that of a shareholder-employee of a corporation incorporated 18 under chapter 607. The business organization shall be liable up to the full value of its property for any negligent acts, 19 wrongful acts, or misconduct committed by any of its officers, 2.0 21 agents, or employees while they are engaged on its behalf in 2.2 the rendering of professional services. Corporations and 23 stockholders who are surveyors and mappers, or partnerships, 2.4 and all partners, shall be jointly and severally liable for 2.5 negligence, misconduct, or wrongful acts committed by 26 their agents, employees, officers, or partners while acting in 27 a professional capacity. 2.8 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005. 29 30
