24	providing for <u>notification of</u> notifying the public and a
25	community of the presence of a career offender or murderer are
26	important aids to law enforcement agencies, the public, and
27	communities if a career offender <u>or murderer</u> engages again in
28	criminal conduct. Registration is intended to aid law
29	enforcement agencies in timely apprehending a career offender
