The supervisor shall safely keep the ballot unopened in his or her 2 office until the county canvassing board canvasses the vote. 3 4 After an absentee ballot is received by the supervisor, the ballot is deemed to have been cast, and changes or additions 5 6 may not be made to the voter's certificate. 7 (2) (c)1. The canvassing board shall, if the supervisor 8 has not already done so, compare the signature of the elector 9 10 on the voter's certificate with the signature of the elector 11 in the registration books to see that the elector is duly registered in the county and to determine the legality of that 12 absentee ballot. Effective July 1, 2005, the ballot of an 13 elector who casts an absentee ballot shall be counted even if 14 15 the elector dies on or before election day, as long as, prior to the death of the voter, the ballot was postmarked by the 16 <u>United States Postal Service</u>, <u>date-stamped with a verifiable</u> 17 tracking number by common carrier, or already in the 18 19 possession of the supervisor of elections. An absentee ballot 20 shall be considered illegal if it does not include the signature of the elector, as shown by the registration 21 22 records. However, an absentee ballot shall not be considered illegal if the signature of the elector does not cross the 23 24 seal of the mailing envelope. If the canvassing board determines that any ballot is illegal, a member of the board 25 shall, without opening the envelope, mark across the face of 26 the envelope: "rejected as illegal." The envelope and the 27 ballot contained therein shall be preserved in the manner that 28 29 official ballots voted are preserved. 30 2. If any elector or candidate present believes that 31 an absentee ballot is illegal due to a defect apparent on the

voter's certificate, he or she may, at any time before the ballot is removed from the envelope, file with the canvassing 2 board a protest against the canvass of that ballot, specifying 3 the precinct, the ballot, and the reason he or she believes the ballot to be illegal.
