Public education. --19 (a) The education of children is a fundamental value 20 21 of the people of the State of Florida. It is, therefore, a 22 paramount duty of the state to make adequate provision for the 23 education of all children residing within its borders. Adequate provision shall be made by law for a uniform, 2.4 25 efficient, safe, secure, and high quality system of free 26 public schools that allows students to obtain a high quality 27 education and for the establishment, maintenance, and 2.8 operation of institutions of higher learning and other public 29 education programs that the needs of the people may require. To assure that children attending public schools obtain a high 30 quality education, the legislature shall make adequate

provision to ensure that, by the beginning of the  $\underline{2007}$   $\underline{2010}$  school year, there are a sufficient number of classrooms so that:

- (1) The <u>district average</u> maximum number of students who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms for prekindergarten through grade 3 does not exceed 18 students;
- (2) The <u>district average</u> maximum number of students who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms for grades 4 through 8 does not exceed 22 students; and
- (3) The <u>district average</u> maximum number of students who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms for grades 9 through 12 does not exceed 25 students.

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The class size requirements of this subsection do not apply to extracurricular classes. Payment of the costs associated with reducing class size to meet these requirements is the responsibility of the state and not of local school schools districts. Beginning with the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the legislature shall provide sufficient funds to reduce the district average class size number of students in each classroom by at least two students per year until the district average class size maximum number of students per classroom does not exceed the requirements of this subsection.

(b) The minimum salary for each public school teacher shall be provided by law but must be no less than \$35,000 and must be higher than the national average beginning salary for public school teachers.

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(c)(b) Every four-year old child in Florida shall be
provided by the State a high quality prekindergarten
pre kindergarten learning opportunity in the form of an early
childhood development and education program which shall be
voluntary, high quality, free, and delivered according to
professionally accepted standards. An early childhood
development and education program means an organized program
designed to address and enhance each child's ability to make
age appropriate progress in an appropriate range of settings
in the development of language and cognitive capabilities and
emotional, social, regulatory and moral capacities through
education in basic skills and such other skills as the
Legislature may determine to be appropriate.

(d)(e) The early childhood education and development programs provided by reason of <u>subsection</u> (c) <u>subparagraph</u> (b) shall be implemented no later than the beginning of the 2005 school year through funds generated in addition to those used for existing education, health, and development programs.

Existing education, health, and development programs are those funded by the State as of January 1, 2002, that provided for child or adult education, health care, or development.
