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29	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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1 Section 1. Section 397.3335, Florida Statutes, is 2 created to read: 397.3335 Statewide Office for Suicide Prevention .--3 4 (1)(a) The Statewide Office for Suicide Prevention is created in the Office of Drug Control within the Executive 5 6 Office of the Governor. 7 (b) The statewide office shall develop a network of 8 community-based programs to improve suicide prevention initiatives. The network shall identify and work to eliminate 9 10 barriers that impede providing suicide prevention services to individuals who are at risk of suicide. 11 12 (c) The network of community-based programs shall consist of stakeholders advocating suicide prevention, 13 including, but not limited to, not-for-profit suicide 14 prevention organizations, faith-based suicide prevention 15 organizations, law enforcement agencies, first responders to 16 17 emergency calls, suicide prevention community coalitions, 18 schools and universities, mental health agencies, substance abuse agencies, health care providers, and school personnel. 19 (2) The statewide office shall, within available 2.0 21 resources: 22 (a) Implement the statewide plan prepared by the 23 Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council; (b) Build a network of community-based programs to 2.4 integrate suicide prevention initiatives into the programs' 25 <u>activities;</u> 26 27 (c) Increase public awareness concerning topics 2.8 relating to suicide prevention; (d) Coordinate education and training curricula in 29 suicide prevention efforts for law enforcement personnel, 30 first responders to emergency calls, health care providers, 31

1 school employees, and other persons who may have contact with 2 persons at risk of suicide; and (e) Direct an interagency workgroup within the Suicide 3 4 Prevention Coordinating Council to prepare a suicide 5 prevention communication plan among state agencies. The 6 communication plan must be incorporated into the council's 7 statewide plan. 8 (3) Contingent upon a specific appropriation, the director of the Office of Drug Control shall employ a 9 10 coordinator for the Statewide Office for Suicide Prevention. In selecting the coordinator, the director of the Office of 11 12 Drug Control should consider whether a candidate has: 13 (a) The following education and employment experience: 1. A bachelor's degree in social work, psychology, 14 sociology, counseling, public health, or a closely related 15 16 field and 5 or more years of work experience in behavioral 17 health care or a closely related field; or 18 2. A master's or a doctoral degree in social work, psychology, sociology, counseling, public health, or a closely 19 related field and 2 or more years of work experience in 20 21 behavioral health or a closely related field. 22 (b) The following skills: 23 Significant professional experience in social services, mental health, or a closely related field; 2.4 2. Knowledge of group behavior and dynamics, methods 25 of facilitation, community development, behavioral health 26 treatment and prevention programs, and community-based 27 2.8 behavioral health problems; Experience in working with community groups and 29 3. constituents that are diverse and representative of the 30 gender, ethnic, and racial populations in this state; and 31

1	4. Experience in writing grant proposals and technical
2	reports.
3	(4) The coordinator shall work under the direction of
4	the director of the Office of Drug Control to achieve the
5	goals and objectives set forth in this section. The
6	coordinator shall:
7	(a) Facilitate an interagency workgroup within the
8	Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council to integrate state
9	agency programs for suicide prevention into a unified
10	statewide plan;
11	(b) Review local, state, and national suicide
12	prevention programs for examples of innovative suicide
13	prevention models. If innovative models are discovered, the
14	coordinator shall prepare a report to describe the feasibility
15	of implementing some or all of the innovation models in this
16	state. The report must be filed with the President of the
17	Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the
18	Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council after review and
19	approval of the report by the director of the Office of Drug
20	Control. The innovative models, and the feasibility of their
21	implementation in this state, shall be evaluated by the
22	Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council, which shall file a
23	report with the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the
24	House of Representatives, and the Governor if the council
25	determines that legislation is necessary to implement an
26	innovative model;
27	(c) Develop and maintain an Internet website with
28	links to appropriate suicide prevention resource documents,
29	suicide hotlines, state and community mental health agencies,
30	and appropriate national suicide prevention organizations;
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1 (d) Identify and disseminate information regarding 2 crisis services for suicide prevention; 3 (e) Join with stakeholders in suicide prevention to 4 develop public awareness and media campaigns in each county 5 directed towards persons who are at risk of suicide; б (f) Provide technical assistance to educational 7 activities for residents of this state relating to suicide 8 prevention; 9 (q) Cooperate with school districts to develop 10 training and counseling programs for school-based suicide prevention activities. The coordinator and school districts 11 12 must also develop a method by which to evaluate each 13 prevention training and counseling program; (h) Join with stakeholders in suicide prevention to 14 develop education and training programs for suicide 15 prevention. The education and training programs must be 16 17 directed first to persons who have face-to-face contact with 18 individuals who may be at risk of suicide. The training must assist persons to recognize when an individual is at risk of 19 suicide and how to properly refer those individuals to 20 21 treatment or support services; 22 (i) Review current research data and findings to 23 identify at-risk populations, factors relating to suicide, and suicide prevention activities and disseminate this research to 2.4 the Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council to develop 25 strategies for preventing suicide; and 26 27 (j) Develop and submit proposals to agencies of the 2.8 state and Federal Government and to nongovernmental organizations for funding suicide prevention activities. 29 (5) The Statewide Office for Suicide Prevention may 30 seek and accept grants or funds from any federal, state, or 31

1 local source to support its operation and defray the expenses incurred in its operation and implementation. 2 3 Section 2. Section 397.3336, Florida Statutes, is 4 created to read: 5 397.3336 Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council; б creation; membership; duties.--There is created within the 7 Office of Drug Control a Suicide Prevention Coordinating 8 Council. The council shall develop strategies for preventing 9 suicide. 10 (1) SCOPE OF ACTIVITY. -- The Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council is a council as defined in s. 20.03(9) 11 12 and shall: 13 (a) Advise the Office of Suicide Prevention regarding the development of a statewide plan for suicide prevention, 14 with the quiding principle being that suicide is a preventable 15 problem. The statewide plan must: 16 17 1. Align and provide direction for statewide suicide 18 prevention initiatives; 19 2. Establish partnerships with state and private agencies to promote public awareness of suicide prevention; 20 21 3. Address specific populations in this state who are 2.2 at risk for suicide; 23 4. Improve access to help individuals in acute 2.4 situations; and 5. Identify resources to support the implementation of 25 the statewide plan. 26 27 (b) Create an interagency workgroup within the council 2.8 in order to incorporate state agency plans for suicide prevention into the statewide plan. The interagency workgroup 29 30 must include, but need not be limited to: 31

1 1. The Secretary of Elderly Affairs, or his or her 2 designee; 3 2. The Secretary of Health, or his or her designee; 4 3. The Commissioner of Education, or his or her 5 designee; 6 4. The Secretary of Health Care Administration, or his 7 or her designee; 8 5. The Secretary of Juvenile Justice, or his or her 9 designee; 10 6. The executive director of the Department of Law Enforcement, or his or her designee; 11 12 7. The Secretary of Children and Family Services, or 13 his or her designee; 8. The Secretary of Corrections, or his or her 14 15 <u>designee;</u> 9. The executive director of the Department of 16 17 Veterans' Affairs, or his or her designee; and 18 10. The director of Workforce Innovation, or his or <u>her designee.</u> 19 (c) Assemble an ad hoc advisory committee with 20 21 membership from outside the council when necessary in order 2.2 for the council to receive advice and assistance in carrying 23 out its responsibilities. (d) Advise the Statewide Office for Suicide 2.4 25 Prevention. (e) Make findings and recommendations regarding 26 27 suicide prevention programs and activities. The council shall 2.8 prepare an annual report and present it to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of 29 Representatives by January 1, 2006, and each year thereafter. 30 The annual report must describe the status of existing and 31

1 planned initiatives identified in the statewide plan for suicide prevention and any recommendations arising therefrom. 2 (2) MEMBERSHIP. -- The Suicide Prevention Coordinating 3 4 Council shall consist of 25 members. 5 (a) Nine members shall be appointed by the director of 6 the Office of Drug Control and shall represent the following 7 organizations: 8 1. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Corporation, , described in s. 394.655; 9 Inc. 10 2. The Florida Association of School Psychologists; 3. The Florida Sheriffs Association; 11 12 The Suicide Prevention Action Network USA; 4. 13 5. The Florida Initiative of Suicide Prevention; 6. The Florida Suicide Prevention Coalition; 14 7. The Alzheimer's Association; 15 8. The Florida School Board Association; 16 17 9. A representative from Volunteer Florida; 18 10. The state chapter of the AARP; and 11. The Florida Alcohol and Drug Abuse Association. 19 (b) The following state officials shall be appointed 20 21 to the coordinating council: 22 1. The Secretary of Elderly Affairs, or his or her 23 designee; 2. The Secretary of Health, or his or her designee; 2.4 3. The Commissioner of Education, or his or her 25 designee; 26 27 4. The Secretary of Health Care Administration, or his 2.8 or her designee; 5. The Secretary of Juvenile Justice, or his or her 29 30 <u>designee;</u> 31

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1 6. The Secretary of Corrections, or his or her 2 designee; 3 7. The executive director of the Department of Law 4 Enforcement, or his or her designee; 5 8. The executive director of Veterans' Affairs, or his б or her designee; 7 9. The Secretary of Children and Family Services, or 8 his or her designee; and 9 10. The director of Workforce Innovation, or his or 10 her designee. (c) The Governor shall appoint four additional members 11 to the coordinating council. The appointees must have 12 13 expertise critical to the prevention of suicide or represent an organization that is not already represented on the 14 coordinating council. 15 (d) Council members shall be appointed to terms of 4 16 17 years each. Any vacancy on the coordinating council shall be 18 filled in the same manner as the original appointment, and any member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring because of death, 19 resignation, or ineligibility for membership shall serve only 2.0 21 for the unexpired term of the member's predecessor. A member 2.2 is eligible for reappointment. 23 (e) Members of the coordinating council shall serve without compensation. Any member of the coordinating council 2.4 who is a public employee is entitled to reimbursement for per 25 diem and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061. 26 27 (3) MEETINGS.--2.8 (a) The director of the Office of Drug Control shall be a nonvoting, ex officio member of the coordinating council 29 30 and shall act as chair. 31

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1 (b) The coordinating council shall meet at least 2 guarterly or upon the call of the chair. The council meetings may be held via teleconference or other electronic means. 3 (c) Public organizations shall participate and 4 5 cooperate with the coordinating council. б Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005. 7 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN 8 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR 9 CS for Senate Bill 210 10 Increases the membership of the Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council from 23 to 25 by adding the state chapter 11 12 of the AARP and the Florida Alcohol and Drug Abuse Association. 13 Clarifies that the Council is an advisory body. 14 Provides flexibility to the director of the Office of Drug Control in hiring the coordinator. 15 Clarifies who must file a report recommending legislation to 16 the Legislature. 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 2.4 25 26 27 28 29 30 31
