18	(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of part I of
19	chapter 464, the Nurse Practice Act, unlicensed direct care
20	services staff providing services to persons with
21	developmental disabilities may administer oral, transdermal,
22	inhaled, or topical prescription medications as provided in

24	(a) For day <u>habilitation services</u> programs , as defined
25	in s. 393.063, the director of the facility or program shall
26	designate in writing unlicensed direct care services staff who
27	are eligible to be trained to assist in the administration of
28	or to administer medication.
29	(b) For intermediate care facilities for the
30	developmentally disabled licensed pursuant to part XI of

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provide medication assistance under the general supervision of a registered nurse licensed pursuant to chapter 464.

- Practice Act, unlicensed direct care staff who provide services to persons with developmental disabilities in a comprehensive transitional education program licensed pursuant to s. 393.067 and who are designated by the director of such program may administer, or assist in the administration of, oral, otic, transdermal, opthalmic, inhaled, rectal, or topical prescription medications under the general supervision of a registered nurse licensed pursuant to chapter 464 as provided in this section.
- (3)(2) Each facility, institution, or program must include in its policies and procedures a plan for training designated staff to ensure the safe handling, storage, and administration of prescription medication. These policies and procedures must be approved by the agency before unlicensed direct care services staff assist with medication.
- (4)(3) The policies and procedures must include, at a minimum, the following provisions:
 - (a) An expressed and informed consent for each client.
- (b) The director of the facility, program, or provider must maintain a copy of the written prescription, and that prescription must include the name of the medication, the dosage and administration schedule, the reason for the prescription, and the termination date.
- (c) Each prescribed medication shall be kept in its original container and in a secure location.
- (5)(4) The training required in this section shall be conducted by a registered nurse or a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or chapter 459.

1	(6) The Agency for Persons with Disabilities shall
2	adopt rules to implement this section.
