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24	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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26	Section 1. Section 1003.416, Florida Statutes, is
27	created to read:
28	1003.416 Academic standards; review; improvement in
29	rigor and career relevance; career academies; rules;

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(1) PURPOSE AND INTENT. -- The purpose of this section 2 is to provide added focus and rigor to academics in the high school so that all students graduate from high school ready 3 4 for postsecondary education and work. Every high school student should receive rigorous academic instruction through 5 6 challenging curricula delivered with relevance to application 7 in unpredictable settings presented by highly qualified 8 teachers in small-school or school-within-a-school environments, and supported by informed parents and engaged 9 10 postsecondary-education, business, and community partners. It is the intent of the Legislature that every student graduate 11 12 from high school ready for postsecondary education and work. 13 (2) CURRICULA AND COURSES. -- The Department of Education shall review the Sunshine State Standards for high 14 school to ensure that they incorporate the appropriate rigor 15 and relevance so that students leave high school prepared for 16 both postsecondary education and the workplace. The 18 Commissioner of Education shall make recommendations to the State Board of Education regarding changes to high school 19 standards and curricula based on research-based programs that 2.0 21 have been proven to be effective. The State Board of Education shall, by March 1, 2006, adopt rules based upon the 2.2 23 commissioner's recommendations. The department shall review current high school graduation requirements and course 2.4 enrollments of high school students to determine the effect of 2.5 increasing high school graduation requirements to include four 2.6 2.7 credits in math and science and eliminate the options for 2.8 satisfying Algebra I. By December 1, 2006, the Commissioner of Education shall submit to the President of the Senate, the 29 Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Governor, and the 30 State Board of Education recommendations to increase the 31

academic rigor of high school graduation requirements for 2 implementation to be phased in beginning by the 2008-2009 school year. 3 4 (3) INSTRUCTIONAL RELEVANCE. -- The department shall review teaching practices and recommend pedagogy in all 5 6 teacher-preparation pathways to ensure that future teachers 7 are able to deliver rigorous instruction in a relevant manner. 8 The department shall develop professional development for current teachers which focuses on student-centered 9 10 instructional strategies that move students from the early learning stage of awareness to higher learning stages of 11 analysis, adaptation, and application of knowledge. 12 13 (4) CAREER ACADEMIES. -- The department shall use school-level accountability data to identify successful career 14 academies or other models of delivering rigorous high school 15 instruction in a relevant manner which lead to increased 16 academic performance of students and schools. The models should include small learning communities or instances of a 18 school-within-a-school, standards based on a college 19 2.0 preparatory curriculum with a career theme, postsecondary 21 education, business and community partners, and nationally recognized and accepted curricula. Based upon the findings, 2.2 23 the department shall develop an implementation process for replicating successful models around the state. The 2.4 implementation process must include recommendations for 2.5 funding necessary to create and sustain the model. 2.6 27 (5) STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AUTHORITY. --2.8 (a) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules under ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer the provisions 29 30 of this section. 31

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(b) The State Board of Education, pursuant to s. 1008.32, shall enforce the provisions of this section.

Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 1006.02, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1006.02 Provision of information to students and parents regarding school-to-work transition.--

(1) To facilitate each student's ability to easily and seamlessly combine academic and career classes throughout the educational experience, each public K-12 school shall document as part of its quidance report that every student has used existing free electronic career planning tools provided by the department to introduce each middle school student and high school student to the career planning process and to conduct career exploration. The report must include the manner in which the school has All public K 12 schools shall document the manner in which they have prepared students to enter the workforce, including information regarding the provision of accurate, timely career and curricular counseling to students. This information must shall include a delineation of available career opportunities, educational requirements associated with each career, educational institutions that prepare students to enter each career, and student financial aid available to enable students to pursue any postsecondary instruction required to enter that career. This information must shall also delineate school procedures for identifying individual student interests and aptitudes which enable students to make informed decisions about the curriculum that best addresses their individual interests and aptitudes while preparing them to enroll in postsecondary education and enter the workforce. This information <u>must</u> shall include recommended high school coursework that prepares students for success in college-level

1	work. The information $\underline{\text{must}}$ $\underline{\text{shall}}$ be made known to parents and
2	students annually through inclusion in the school's handbook,
3	manual, or similar documents or other communications regularly
4	provided to parents and students.
5	Section 3. Paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of section
6	1006.025, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
7	1006.025 Guidance services
8	(2) The guidance report shall include, but not be
9	limited to, the following:
10	(f) Actions taken to provide information to students
11	for the school-to-work transition and documentation that every
12	student has used existing free electronic career planning
13	tools provided by the department to introduce each middle
14	school student and high school student to the career planning
15	process and to conduct career exploration pursuant to s.
16	1006.02.
17	Section 4. (1) The Department of Education shall
18	conduct an articulation audit for postsecondary vocational
19	education which:
20	(a) Is focused on courses and programs within the
21	industry sectors that have been targeted by Enterprise Florida
22	for economic development;
23	(b) Identifies specific areas of improvement needed to
24	maximize credit given to public postsecondary students; and
25	(c) Identifies local articulation agreements that
26	could be replicated statewide.
27	(2) The audit required under subsection (1) must be
28	completed by December 31, 2005.
29	Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
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\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* SENATE SUMMARY Provides for the Department of Education to review the Sunshine State Standards for high school in order to determine how to make instruction more relevant to postsecondary education and careers. Requires the Commissioner of Education to make recommendations to the State Board of Education. Provides for rulemaking. Provides duties of the department relating to teacher preparation for the purpose of ensuring instructional relevance. Requires the department to identify career academies and other models for delivering high school instruction. Requires each public school's guidance report to document that students have used certain career planning tools. Requires the department to conduct an articulation audit for postsecondary vocational education and to complete the audit by December 31, 2005. Provides requirements for the audit.
