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correcting a reference; providing a contingent 1 2 effective date. 3 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 4 5 6 Section 1. Section 11.90, Florida Statutes, is amended 7 to read: 8 11.90 Legislative Budget Commission.--(1) There is created the Legislative Budget 9 Commission, which is the joint Legislative Budget Commission 10 created in s. 19, Art. III of the State Constitution, composed 11 of seven members of the Senate appointed by the President of 12 13 the Senate and seven members of the House of Representatives 14 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Each member shall serve at the pleasure of the officer who 15 appointed the member. A vacancy on the commission shall be 16 filled in the same manner as the original appointment. From 17 18 November of each odd-numbered year through October of each 19 even-numbered year, the chairperson of the commission shall be appointed by the President of the Senate and the vice 20 chairperson of the commission shall be appointed by the 21 22 Speaker of the House of Representatives. From November of each 23 even-numbered year through October of each odd-numbered year, 24 the chairperson of the commission shall be appointed the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the vice 25 chairperson of the commission shall be appointed by the 26 President of the Senate. There is created a standing joint 27 28 committee of the Legislature designated the Legislative Budget 29 Commission, composed of 14 members as follows: seven members 30 of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, to include the chair of the Senate Budget Committee or its 31

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1	successor, and seven members of the House of Representatives
2	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, to
3	include the chair of the Fiscal Responsibility Council or its
4	successor. The terms of members shall be for 2 years and shall
5	run from the organization of one Legislature to the
6	organization of the next Legislature. <del>Vacancies occurring</del>
7	during the interim period shall be filled in the same manner
8	as the original appointment. During even numbered years, the
9	chair of the commission shall be the chair of the Senate
10	Budget Committee or its successor, and the vice chair of the
11	commission shall be the chair of the House Fiscal
12	Responsibility Council or its successor. During odd numbered
13	years, the chair of the commission shall be the chair of the
14	House Fiscal Responsibility Council or its successor, and the
15	vice chair of the commission shall be the chair of the Senate
16	Budget Committee or its successor.
17	(2) The Legislative Budget Commission shall be
18	governed by joint rules of the Senate and the House of
19	Representatives which shall remain in effect until repealed or
20	amended by concurrent resolution.
21	(3) The commission shall convene at the call of the
22	President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
23	Representatives at least quarterly. A majority of the
24	commission members of each house plus one additional member
25	from either house constitutes a quorum. The commission shall
26	meet at least quarterly. A quorum shall consist of a majority
27	of members from each house, plus one additional member from
28	either house. Action by the commission requires a majority
29	vote of the members present of each house.
30	(4) The commission may conduct its meetings through
31	teleconferences or other similar means.

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1	(5) The commission shall be staffed by legislative
2	staff members, as assigned by the President of the Senate and
3	the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The commission
4	will be jointly staffed by the appropriations committees of
5	the House of Representatives and the Senate. During
6	even numbered years, the Senate will serve as lead staff, and
7	during odd numbered years, the House of Representatives will
8	serve as lead staff.
9	(6) The commission shall have the power and duty to:
10	(a) <u>Review and approve or disapprove budget amendments</u>
11	proposed by the Governor or the Chief Justice of the Supreme
12	Court as provided in chapter 216. Annually review the amount
13	of state debt outstanding and submit to the President of the
14	Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives an
15	estimate of the maximum amount of additional state
16	tax supported debt that prudently may be authorized during the
17	current fiscal year. The estimate shall be advisory and shall
18	in no way bind the Legislature.
19	(b) <u>Develop the long-range financial outlook described</u>
20	in s. 19, Art. III of the State Constitution Promptly after
21	receiving the report required by s. 215.98(2)(c), the
22	commission shall submit to the President of the Senate and the
23	<del>Speaker of the House of Representatives the commission's</del>
24	estimate of tax supported debt which prudently may be
25	authorized for the next fiscal year, together with a report
26	explaining the basis for the estimate.
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28	In addition to the powers and duties specified in this
29	section, the commission shall exercise all other powers and
30	perform any other duties prescribed by the Legislature.
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1	(7) The commission shall review information resources
2	management needs identified in agency long-range program plans
3	for consistency with the State Annual Report on Enterprise
4	Resource Planning and Management and statewide policies
5	adopted by the State Technology Office. The commission shall
6	also review proposed budget amendments associated with
7	information technology that involve more than one agency, that
8	have an outcome that impacts another agency, or that exceed
9	\$500,000 in total cost over a 1-year period.
10	Section 2. Section 11.91, Florida Statutes, is created
11	to read:
12	11.91 Government Efficiency Task Force
13	(1) There is created the Government Efficiency Task
14	Force. The task force shall convene no later than January of
15	2007, and each fourth year thereafter. The task force shall be
16	composed of 13 members. Five members shall be appointed by the
17	President of the Senate, five members shall be appointed by
18	the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and three members
19	shall be appointed by the Governor. Members of the task force
20	may include representatives from the private sector, as
21	designated by the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the
22	House of Representatives, and the Governor. Each member shall
23	serve at the pleasure of the offficer who appointed the
24	member. A vacancy on the task force shall be filled in the
25	same manner as the original appointment. The terms of the
26	members shall be for 1 year.
27	(2) The task force shall elect a chair from among its
28	members.
29	(3) The task force shall meet as necessary, but at
30	least quarterly, at the call of the chair and at the time and
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place designated by him or her. The task force may conduct its 1 2 meetings through teleconferences or other similar means. 3 (4) Members of the task force are entitled to receive 4 reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses pursuant to s. 5 112.061. б (5) The task force shall develop recommendations for 7 improving governmental operations and reducing costs. Staff to 8 assist the task force in performing its duties shall be assigned by the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the 9 House of Representatives, and the Governor. 10 (6) The task force shall complete its works within 1 11 year and submit its recommendations to the chair and vice 12 13 chair of the Legislative Budget Commission, the Governor, and 14 the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. The task force may submit all or part of its recommendations at any time during 15 the year, but a final report summarizing its recommendations 16 must be submitted at the completion of its work. 17 18 Section 3. Subsection (4) of section 29.0095, Florida 19 Statutes, is amended to read: 29.0095 Budget expenditure reports.--20 (4) The appropriations committees of the Senate and 21 22 the House of Representatives Legislative Budget Commission 23 shall prescribe the format of the report required by this 24 section in consultation with the Chief Justice and the Justice Administrative Commission. 25 26 Section 4. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 110.1245, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 27 28 110.1245 Savings sharing program; bonus payments; 29 other awards.--30 (1)31

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(b) Each agency head shall recommend employees 1 2 individually or by group to be awarded an amount of money, 3 which amount shall be directly related to the cost savings realized. Each proposed award and amount of money must be 4 approved by the Legislative Budget Budgeting Commission. 5 Section 5. Paragraph (h) of subsection (1) of section б 7 216.011, Florida Statutes, is amended, and paragraph (rr) is 8 added to that subsection, to read: 9 216.011 Definitions.--(1) For the purpose of fiscal affairs of the state, 10 appropriations acts, legislative budgets, and approved 11 budgets, each of the following terms has the meaning 12 13 indicated: 14 (h) "Consultation" means communication on fiscal matters between the Governor and the Legislature to deliberate 15 and seek advice in an open and forthright manner with the full 16 committee, a subcommittee thereof, the chair, or the staff as 17 18 deemed appropriate by the chair of the respective 19 appropriations committee. (rr) "Long-range financial outlook" means a 3-year 20 plan, developed by the commission and updated annually using 21 22 official information, including, but not limited to, 23 projections developed by the consensus estimating conferences, 24 which projects state revenues and expenditures and provides the framework and context for legislative budget requests 25 prepared by state agencies. 26 27 Section 6. Section 216.012, Florida Statutes, is 28 created to read: 29 216.012 Long-range financial outlook.--(1) The commission shall develop a long-range 3-year 30 31 <u>financial outlook and shall update that plan each year.</u>

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1	(2) Each state agency shall provide information to the
2	commission, based on the commission's direction, which
3	supports the commission's development and updates of the
4	long-range financial outlook.
5	(a) By July 1 of each year, the commission shall
6	provide the fiscal strategies of the long-range financial
7	outlook to the state agencies.
8	(b) By July 31 of each year, state agencies shall
9	provide estimates of the funding that would be necessary to
10	implement the fiscal strategies.
11	(c) By August 15 of each year, the commission shall:
12	1. Accept the estimates provided by an agency;
13	2. Modify the estimates provided by an agency; or
14	3. Direct an agency to modify its estimates,
15	consistent with directions specified by the commission.
16	(d) By August 31 of each year, an agency directed to
17	modify its estimate shall provide new estimates to the
18	commission.
19	(e) By September 15 of each year, the commission shall
20	complete the long-range financial outlook.
21	Section 7. Subsections (1) and (13) of section
22	216.023, Florida Statutes, are amended, and paragraph (c) is
23	added to subsection (4) of that section, to read:
24	216.023 Legislative budget requests to be furnished to
25	Legislature by agencies
26	(1) The head of each state agency, except as provided
27	in subsection (2), shall submit a final legislative budget
28	request to the Legislature and to the Governor, as chief
29	budget officer of the state, in the form and manner prescribed
30	in the budget instructions and at such time as specified by
31	the Executive Office of the Governor, based on the agency's

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independent judgment of its needs. However, <u>a</u> no state agency 1 2 may not shall submit its complete legislative budget request, including all supporting forms and schedules required by this 3 chapter, later than October September 15 of any each year, 4 unless an alternative date is agreed to be in the best 5 interests of the state by the President of the Senate, the б 7 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Governor. 8 (4) 9 (c) The legislative budget request submitted by each agency must reflect the long-range financial outlook adopted 10 by the joint Legislative Budget Commission, either by basing 11 specific requests on the long-range financial outlook or by 12 13 explaining how any specific request varies from the long-range 14 financial outlook. 15 (13) In order to ensure an integrated state planning and budgeting process, the agency long-range plan should be 16 reviewed by the Legislature. The legislative budget request 17 18 instructions must provide for consistency between the agency's 19 long-range plan and the agency's legislative budget request. Section 8. Section 216.065, Florida Statutes, is 20 amended to read: 21 22 216.065 Fiscal impact statements on actions affecting 23 the budget .-- In addition to the applicable requirements of 24 chapter 120, before the Governor, or Governor and Cabinet as a body, performing any constitutional or statutory duty, or 25 before any state agency or statutorily authorized entity takes 26 take any final action that will affect revenues, directly 27 28 require a request for an increased or new appropriation in the 29 following <u>3</u> fiscal <u>years</u>, <del>year</del> or <del>that will</del> transfer current 30 year funds, it they shall first provide the joint Legislative Budget Commission and the legislative appropriations 31

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committees with a fiscal impact statement that details the 1 2 effects of such action on the budget. The fiscal impact statement must specify the estimated budget and revenue 3 impacts for the current year and the 2 subsequent fiscal years 4 at the same level of detail required to support a legislative 5 budget request, including amounts by appropriation category б 7 and fund. 8 Section 9. Subsection (1) of section 216.162, Florida 9 Statutes, is amended to read: 216.162 Governor's recommended budget to be furnished 10 Legislature; copies to members. --11 (1) At least 30 45 days before the scheduled annual 12 13 legislative session, or at a later date if requested by the 14 Governor and approved in writing by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the 15 Governor shall furnish each senator and representative a copy 16 of his or her recommended balanced budget for the state, based 17 18 on the Governor's own conclusions and judgment; provided, 19 however, that in his or her first year in office a new Governor may request, subject to approval of the President of 20 21 the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, 22 that his or her recommended balanced budget be submitted at a 23 later time prior to the Governor's first regular legislative 24 session. Section 10. Subsection (2) of section 216.178, Florida 25 Statutes, is amended to read: 26 216.178 General Appropriations Act; format; 27 28 procedure.--29 (2) The Office of Planning and Budgeting shall develop 30 a final budget report that reflects the net appropriations for 31 each budget item. The report shall reflect actual

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1	expenditures for each of the 2 preceding fiscal years and the
2	estimated expenditures for the current fiscal year. In
3	addition, the report must contain the actual revenues and cash
4	balances for the preceding 2 fiscal years and the estimated
5	revenues and cash balances for the current fiscal year. The
6	report may also contain expenditure data, program objectives,
7	and program measures for each state agency program. The report
8	must be produced by <u>the 120th day of</u> <del>October 15</del> each <u>fiscal</u>
9	year. A copy of the report must be made available to each
10	member of the Legislature, to the head of each state agency,
11	to the Auditor General, to the director of the Office of
12	Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability, and to
13	the public.
14	Section 11. Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section
15	216.262, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
16	216.262 Authorized positions
17	(1)
18	(c)1. The Executive Office of the Governor, under such
19	procedures and qualifications as it deems appropriate, shall,
20	upon agency request, delegate to any state agency authority to
21	add and delete authorized positions or transfer authorized
22	positions from one budget entity to another budget entity
23	within the same division, and may approve additions and
24	deletions of authorized positions or transfers of authorized
25	positions within the state agency when such changes would
26	enable the agency to administer more effectively its
27	authorized and approved programs. The additions or deletions
28	must be consistent with the intent of the approved operating
29	budget, must be consistent with legislative policy and intent,
30	and must not conflict with specific spending policies
31	specified in the General Appropriations Act.

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1	2. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall have
2	the authority to establish procedures for the judicial branch
3	to add and delete authorized positions or transfer authorized
4	positions from one budget entity to another budget entity, and
5	to add and delete authorized positions within the same budget
6	entity, when such changes are consistent with legislative
7	policy and intent and do not conflict with spending policies
8	specified in the General Appropriations Act.
9	3.a. A state agency may be eligible to retain salary
10	dollars for authorized positions eliminated after July 1,
11	2001. The agency must certify the eliminated positions to the
12	Legislative <u>Budget</u> Budgeting Commission.
13	b. The Legislative <u>Budget</u> <del>Budgeting</del> Commission shall
14	authorize the agency to retain 20 percent of the salary
15	dollars associated with the eliminated positions and may
16	authorize retention of a greater percentage. All such salary
17	dollars shall be used for permanent salary increases.
18	Section 12. This act shall take effect upon the
19	effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution
20	contained in Senate Joint Resolution No. 2144, or a similar
21	constitutional amendment, relating to the state budgeting,
22	planning, and appropriations processes.
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
