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1 (b) (2) Information relating to the place where a 2 person registered to vote or where a person updated a voter registration. 3 4 (c) The social security number and the telephone number of a voter registration applicant or a voter. 5 6 (2) The signature of a voter registration applicant or 7 a voter is confidential and exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution; and 8 a voter's signature, social security number, and telephone 9 10 number may not be copied and is are exempt for that purpose from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of 11 the State Constitution. 12 13 Section 2. <u>Section 97.0585</u>, Florida Statutes, as amended by this act, is subject to the Open Government Sunset 14 Review Act of 1995 in accordance with section 119.15, Florida 15 Statutes, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2010, unless 16 reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the 17 18 Legislature. 19 Section 3. (1) The Legislature recognizes that the Help America Vote Act of 2002 requires the implementation of a 20 new single, uniform, centralized, interactive, and 21 22 computerized statewide voter registration system by January 1, 2006. The Florida Voter Registration System (FVRS) will 23 2.4 replace the existing state's voter registration system. The FVRS will interface with and integrate voter registration 25 information and records from the offices of the 67 county 26 supervisors of elections. The FVRS will contain the name and 27 other registration information of every legally registered 28 29 voter in the state. The FVRS will be the official list of registered voters in the state and will be used as the 30 registration system for federal and state elections. Any such

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system must keep information concerning a person's decision not to register or information concerning the place where a 2 person registers to vote confidential in accordance with the 3 4 National Voter Registration Act. Therefore, the Legislature finds it necessary to continue the existing public-records 5 6 exemption to keep such information confidential and exempt in 7 order to conform with the requirements of the National Voter Registration Act. Additionally, because persons may register 8 to vote or update voter registration information at designated 9 10 voter registration agencies that may include any office that 11 provides public assistance, this exemption is also necessary to protect from disclosure personal information concerning 12 13 those persons who apply for or receive public assistance at 14 these offices. 15 (2) The Legislature also finds it necessary to continue and expand the existing exemption from public-records 16 access to social security numbers and telephone numbers of 17 voters and voter registration applicants. The Legislature 18 19 finds that access to such information can lead to fraud, 20 personal identity theft, and invasion of privacy. The Florida Voter Statewide Voter Registration System, once implemented 21 22 and maintained, will constitute one of the most comprehensive and up-to-date databases of persons in this state. The 23 2.4 Legislature finds it not only necessary to continue to exempt from copying social security numbers and telephone numbers of 25 those persons in the Florida Voter Registration System but 26 27 also to exempt those numbers from inspection. Even the memorization of a single person's social security number or 28 29 telephone number could result in economic and personal harm to that individual whose numbers may be used to perpetuate fraud 30 or may be coupled with other readily available public

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information to commit personal identity theft or to gain access to records, such as financial, educational, or medical 2 records. The Legislature also finds it necessary to continue 3 4 to keep the social security numbers and telephone numbers in 5 the Florida Voter Registration System confidential and exempt in order to encourage voter registration and remove 7 disincentives to registering to vote. (3) The Legislature also finds it necessary to 8 continue and to expand the existing exemption that precludes 9 10 the copying of a voter's signature. Currently, a voter's 11 signature is exempt from copying but only if contained on a voter registration application or precinct register. Two 12 13 advisory opinions from the Attorney General issued in 2001 stated that a voter's signature on an absentee ballot 14 15 certificate is not part of the voter registration record and therefore not exempt from copying. Because express exemption 16 from copying did not exist for absentee ballot certificates, 17 18 any person or entity may request and obtain copies of all 19 signatures of voters who voted absentee in any particular 20 election. Consequently, any person or entity may also request and obtain copies of all signatures of voters who signed 21 22 provisional ballot envelopes, early voting certificates, or any other voting-related documents other than a voter 23 2.4 registration application or a precinct register. The Legislature intends that a voter's signature be protected in 25 order to prevent fraud, identity theft, or invasion of privacy 26 in all instances. Nonetheless, the Legislature finds that any 27 exemption for such signatures must be balanced against the 28 29 continuing administrative need to allow for public inspection of the signatures of voters or voter registration applicants 30 for purposes of voter verification, matching, or authenticity

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1	as may occur in a voter's challenge or canvassing of an
2	absentee ballot. Therefore, the Legislature finds that it is a
3	public necessity to continue the existing exemption solely
4	from copying of voters' signatures and to expand that
5	exemption to apply to voters' signatures as may also appear on
6	absentee ballot certificate envelopes, provisional ballot
7	envelopes, early-voting certificates, or any other
8	voting-related document that must be executed for purposes of
9	voting or voter registration.

11	that Senate Bill 2176 or similar legislation takes effect, if
12	such legislation is enacted in the same legislative session or
13	an extension thereof and becomes law.
