11 injuries that ~~which~~ may occur during athletic activities. The
12 program should reflect opportunities for progressive
13 advancement and compensation in employment as provided in
14 subsection (2) and meet certain other minimum standards
15 developed by the Department of Education. The goal of the
16 Legislature is to have school districts employ and have
17 available a full-time ~~teacher~~ athletic trainer in each high
18 school in the state.

SENATE SUMMARY

Revises the requirements for licensure as an athletic trainer. Revises the criteria for continuing education in athletic training. Provides that a person who practices athletic training without holding an active license commits a first-degree misdemeanor. Provides that a person employed as a teacher apprentice trainer is not exempt from the requirements of part XIII of ch. 468, F.S. Deletes the employment classification of first responder in a school district's athletic injuries prevention and treatment program. Authorizes a licensed athletic trainer to be employed in a school district's athletic injuries and prevention program.
