School-Based Health-Care Task Force.--13 (1) The School-Based Health-Care Task Force is established within the Department of Education for the purpose 14 of facilitating and encouraging development of comprehensive 15 primary-health centers in public elementary, middle, and high 16 schools to provide preventive health services, acute 17 18 primary-health-care services, chronic-disease treatment and management services, case management, counseling, and 19 appropriate referral of specialty health-care services. After 20 21 submitting its final report on or before December 31, 2005, 2.2 the task force is dissolved. 23 (2) The task force consists of 15 members: (a) Two Senators appointed by the President of the 2.4 Senate, one of whom shall be designated to chair the task 25 force; 26 27 (b) A Senator appointed by the Minority Leader of the 28 Senate; (c) A member of the House of Representatives appointed 29 30 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 31

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1 (d) A member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives; 2 3 (e) The Secretary of Health, or his or her designee; 4 (f) The Secretary of Health Care Administration, or his or her designee; 5 б (q) The Commissioner of Education, or his or her 7 <u>designee;</u> (h) A school board member or designee from a district 8 currently representing school-based health centers, appointed 9 10 by The Florida School Boards Association, Inc.; (i) A community-based member appointed by the Florida 11 12 Coalition of School Based Health Care or its designee; (j) A representative of an academic institution, 13 hospital, or a hospital associated with a school-based health 14 15 <u>center;</u> 16 (k) A person appointed by the Florida Association of 17 Health Maintenance Organizations; 18 (1) A person appointed by the Florida Association of Community Health Centers, Inc.; 19 (m) A person appointed by the Florida Rural Health 20 21 Association; and 22 (n) A representative of health insurance companies 23 appointed by the Chief Financial Officer. (2) The task force shall meet at the call of the 2.4 chair. The first meeting of the task force shall be held in 25 Tallahassee no later than July 15, 2005. 2.6 27 (3) The task force shall: 2.8 (a) Identify and examine existing programs, services, laws, and rules regarding the availability and coverage of 29 30 health-care services for public-school students. 31

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1 (b) Receive and consider reports and testimony from 2 individuals, educators, county health departments, 3 community-based organizations, and other public and private 4 organizations. 5 (c) Develop a comprehensive School-Based Health-Care б Plan and present its final report and recommendations to the 7 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the 8 House of Representatives by December 31, 2005. The School-Based Health-Care Plan shall address: 9 10 1. Providing school-based health center services as a means of extending access to care for medically underserved 11 12 children across the state; 13 2. Providing a role for school-based health centers as a safety-net provider within the state; 14 3. Inclusion of the school-based-health-center model 15 in statewide health-planning activities and mandatory federal 16 17 health plans, including the state's Title V long-term 18 strategic plan, as appropriate; 4. The relationship of school-based health centers to 19 integrated-services initiatives, including 20 21 prevention/wellness; chronic-disease management; and mental 2.2 health; 23 5. The relationship of school-based health centers to insurance and other reimbursement mechanisms, including 2.4 Medicaid and the Florida Kidcare program; 25 6. The feasibility of establishing standards of care 26 27 and procedures for statewide certification of school-based 2.8 health centers; and Development of long-term funding strategies to 29 7. 30 ensure adequate financial support for school-based health 31 centers.

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(4) Members of the task force serve without compensation, and the cost of members' participation shall be borne by their appointing organization. Any member who is a public employee is entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses by the appointing department in accordance with section 112.061, Florida Statutes. (5) The Department of Education shall provide logistical and staff support for the task force. Section 2.
