Senate Resolution No. 2 A resolution honoring Florida's Legal Services and Legal Aid Attorneys and recognizing April 3 6, 2005, as "Legal Aid Day" in Tallahassee. 4 5 6 WHEREAS, more than 13 percent of all Floridians are 7 living in poverty, and 8 WHEREAS, in passing the Florida Access to Civil Legal Assistance Act, the Florida Legislature has recognized the 9 importance of civil legal assistance to the poor and the need 10 to improve their access to justice, and 11 12 WHEREAS, in 1973, the Florida Bar and representatives 13 of the Governor formed Florida Legal Services, Inc., to expand the availability of civil legal assistance to the poor in 14 Florida, and 15 WHEREAS, Florida Legal Services, Inc., has become the 16 17 lead organization for preserving and improving legal assistance to indigent and vulnerable Floridians through 18 direct representation, legislative and administrative 19 advocacy, training, technical support, and coordination of 20 effort for the local legal services and legal aid offices that 2.1 provide legal assistance in all of the state's 67 counties, 23 and WHEREAS, by working with local Legal Services and Legal 2.4 Aid Attorneys throughout the state, and in conjunction with 25 Florida legislators, Florida Legal Services, Inc., has 26 successfully obtained legal protections for people moving from 27 welfare to work, legal protection for Medicaid recipients, 29 regulation of day-labor operations, legal protections for the homeless, legal protections for residential tenants, 30 restrictions on predatory mortgage-lending practices, and
