the individual has made a good-faith effort to comply with this
section but has failed to comply because of illness or unusual
hardship. The individual must apply to the board, or the
department if there is no board, for reinstatement in a manner
prescribed by rules of the board or the department, as
applicable, and shall pay an applicable fee in an amount
determined by rule. The board, or the department if there is no
board, shall require that such individual meet all continuing
education requirements prescribed by law, pay appropriate
licensing fees, and otherwise be eligible for renewal of
licensure under this chapter.
