Accessibility, utilization, and 11 12 coordination of appropriate assistive technology devices and 13 services are essential as a young person with disabilities moves from preschool to school, from one school to another, 14 and from school to employment or independent living. To ensure 15 that an assistive technology device issued to a young person 16 as part of his or her individual support plan or individual 17 education plan remains with the individual through such 18 transitions, interagency agreements shall be developed and 19 executed. The request that an assistive technology device 20 21 remain with an individual as he or she moves through the 22 continuum from home to school to postschool must be made by 23 the individual or his or her parent or quardian. Interagency agreements shall be entered into by the following: 2.4 (1) The Florida Infants and Toddlers Early 25 Intervention Program in the Division of Children's Medical 26 27 Services of the Department of Health. 2.8 (2) The Division of Blind Services, the Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student Services, and the Division 29 30 of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Department of Education. 31

(3) The Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program administered by the Department of Education and the Agency for Workforce Innovation. Interagency agreements shall provide a system for ensuring that young persons with disabilities and their families, educators, and employers are informed about the utilization and coordination of assistive technology devices and services that may assist in meeting transition needs. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005. 

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
