Section 461.014, Florida Statutes, is amended 16 to read: 17 461.014 Residency.--18 (1)The board shall encourage and develop podiatric 19 residency programs in hospitals in this state and shall 20 establish such programs by the adoption promulgation of rules, 21 subject to the following conditions: 22 (a) (1) Any residency program shall be approved by the 23 Council of Podiatry Education of the American Podiatry 24 Association. 25 (b) (2) A residency program may be established only at a 26 hospital where a duly licensed podiatric physician is on the 27 hospital staff or is otherwise in a supervisory position. 28 (c) Every resident shall register with the board

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through the submission of forms provided by the board, which 29 forms shall, besides other required information, reflect the 30 31 date of commencement of residency. 32 (d) (d) (4) Every hospital having a residency program shall 33 annually, on semiannually, on January 1 and July 1 of each year, provide the board with a list of podiatric residents and such 34 35 other information as is required by the board. 36 (e) (5) A No program in residency may not shall allow a 37 resident to continue as an such, unlicensed resident, for an 38 aggregate period of time in excess of $3\frac{2}{2}$ years. (f) A person registered as a resident podiatric physician 39 under this section may, in the normal course of his or her 40 41 employment, prescribe medicinal drugs described in schedules set 42 forth in chapter 893 if: 43 1. The person prescribes such medicinal drugs through use 44 of a Drug Enforcement Administration number issued to the hospital or teaching hospital by which the person is employed or 45 at which the person's services are used. 46 47 2. The person is identified by a discrete suffix to the 48 identification number issued to such hospital. 49 The use of the institutional identification number and 3. 50 individual suffixes conforms to the requirements of the federal Drug Enforcement Administration. 51 52 (2) Any person who willfully violates this section commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 53 775.082 or s. 775.083. 54 55 (3) The board shall adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) 56 and 120.54 as necessary to administer this section.
