11	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

13	Section 1. (1) A person who owns a private fire hydrant
14	must ensure that the hydrant is tested in accordance with
15	National Fire Protection Association Standard 24, subsection 4-
16	3.6, and that it is inspected and maintained in compliance with
17	National Fire Protection Association Standard 25, Standard for
18	the Inspection, Testing, and Maintenance of Water-Based Fire
19	Protection Systems, the edition currently adopted by the State
20	Fire Marshal pursuant to its code-adoption and standards-
21	adoption authority in chapter 633, Florida Statutes. A person
22	who owns a private fire hydrant must produce, upon request of an
23	authorized fire official, a valid and continuing maintenance
24	contract with a plumbing contractor licensed under chapter 489,
25	Florida Statutes, an underground utility contractor licensed
26	under chapter 489, Florida Statutes, or, if the private hydrant
27	is part of a fire suppression system, a fire protection
28	contractor licensed under chapter 633, Florida Statutes.
