21-1718-05 1 Senate Resolution No. 2 A resolution paying tribute to the 50th Anniversary of Mote Marine Laboratory. 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Mote Marine Laboratory was created in 1955 by 6 the now-famous shark researcher Dr. Eugenie Clark, with 7 support from William and Alfred Vanderbilt, and was known then 8 as the Cape Haze Marine Laboratory and was humbly housed in a 12-foot-by-20-foot shed in Placida, Florida, and 9 WHEREAS, during the laboratory's first decade of 10 existence, its reputation grew as did its facilities, and 11 12 WHEREAS, under the guidance of many people dedicated to 13 the laboratory's success, including former director William R. Mote and current president Dr. Kumar Mahadevan, the laboratory 14 has grown to encompass eight buildings for research, 15 education, and conferences located on a 10.5-acre campus in 16 17 Sarasota, Florida, with research and education also going forward in a Sarasota inland aquaculture park and in field 18 stations in Charlotte Harbor and in the Florida Keys, and 19 20 WHEREAS, after starting with only a handful of 21 researchers focused solely on sharks, Mote Marine Laboratory 22 is now a powerhouse of nearshore marine research, studying 23 everything from sharks to red tide to marine mammals and fisheries at seven centers, and 2.4 WHEREAS, the laboratory has also made a significant 25 commitment to public education through its aquarium, which 26 27 draws 400,000 visitors annually, and through its on-campus and 2.8 distance-learning programs, which educate more than 50,000 K-12 and college students, and 29 30 31
