With respect to a minor child who is living at home, the parent or legal guardian 14 15 seeking the protective injunction on behalf of the minor child must: 16 1. Have been an eyewitness to, or have direct physical 17 18 evidence or affidavits from eyewitnesses of, the specific 19 facts and circumstances which form the basis upon which relief is sought, if the party against whom the protective injunction 20 is sought is also a parent, stepparent, or legal guardian of 21 22 the minor child; or 2. Have reasonable cause to believe that the minor 23 2.4 child is a victim of repeat, sexual, or dating violence to 25

2. Have reasonable cause to believe that the minor child is a victim of repeat, sexual, or dating violence to form the basis upon which relief is sought, if the party against whom the protective injunction is sought is a person other than a parent, stepparent, or legal guardian of the minor child.
