18	commencement exercise or a secondary school-related
19	noncompulsory student assembly. The resolution must provide:
20	(1) That the use of an inspirational message shall be at
21	the discretion of the students.
22	(2) That an inspirational message, if used, shall be given

29	solemnization and memorialization of secondary school events and

32	Section 3. If any provision of this act or the application
33	thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
34	invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of
35	the act that can be given effect without the invalid provision
36	or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are
37	declared severable.
38	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
