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faithfully, using the books and materials required, following the prescribed courses of study, and employing approved methods of instruction, the following:

27 (q) A character-development program in the elementary schools, similar to Character First or Character Counts, which 28 29 is secular in nature and stresses such character qualities as attentiveness, patience, and initiative. Beginning in school 30 31 year 2004-2005, the character-development program shall be 32 required in kindergarten through grade 12. Each district school 33 board shall develop or adopt a curriculum for the character-34 development program that shall be submitted to the department 35 for approval. A curriculum developed or adopted by a district 36 school board and approved by the department may be shared with other school districts. The department shall provide electronic 37 access to school districts to character-development curricula 38 39 and programs that have been approved by the department. 40 Additionally, the department shall provide technical assistance to district school boards to assist school districts in 41 42 developing a model character-development curriculum to meet the 43 requirements of this paragraph. The character-development 44 curriculum shall define character to include its cognitive, 45 emotional, and behavioral dimensions; stress the qualities of 46 patriotism, responsibility, citizenship, kindness, respect, 47 honesty, self-control, tolerance, and cooperation; provide for an orderly learning environment to enable students to make 48 49 positive lifestyle choices and avoid unhealthy behavior; create 50 a positive moral culture in the classroom and the school; and 51 develop moral character and civic virtue in students as one Page 2 of 3
