A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Financial Literacy Council; creating s. 624.35, F.S.; providing legislative findings; creating the council; providing purposes; providing for membership; providing for meetings, procedures, records, and reimbursement for travel and per diem expenses; providing powers and duties of the council; providing for resources of the council; requiring annual reports to the Governor and Legislature; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 624.35, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

15 624.35 Financial Literacy Council.--

- (1) CREATION. --The Legislature finds that financial issues can be complex and confusing to many consumers and small businesses. As a result, the number of bankruptcies have almost doubled over the past 10 years, seniors are frequently the targets of investment scams, more students drop out of college due to credit card debt than due to failing grades, and many consumers and small businesses are hurt by delaying or avoiding important money issues due to fear of making the wrong financial decisions. There is a dire need of user-friendly information and education that will increase the financial literacy of small businesses and consumers. Therefore, the Financial Literacy Council is created.
  - (2) PURPOSES. -- The purposes of the council are to:

(a) Provide a single state resource for consumers and small businesses to contact for assistance regarding basic financial information.

- (b) Equip small businesses, young people, working adults, and seniors with the tools and resources they need to make informed financial decisions.
- (c) Help residents of this state learn more about personal finance issues, including, but not limited to, applying for loans, making sound investment choices, and saving for retirement.
- (d) Facilitate the sharing of best practices that are characteristic of highly successful small businesses.
- (e) Serve as an educational forum for resource planning, financial planning, and management issues for small businesses.
  - (3) COMPOSITION. --

(a) Members of the council shall include the Chief
Financial Officer, or her or his designee, and not more than 14
other members to be appointed by the Chief Financial Officer,
selected from various areas of the financial industry, such as
banking, finance, insurance, real estate, and securities, who
are, when possible, leading members of statewide organizations
representing all segments of the financial industry so as to
establish a broadly based and representative council. Appointed
members shall include persons who represent rural and urban
interests and the ethnic and cultural diversity of the state's
population. At least one member must be chosen from a list of
three persons submitted to the Chief Financial Officer by a
senior advocacy group. At least one member must be chosen from a

list of three persons submitted to the Chief Financial Officer by the Florida Council on Economic Education.

- (b) Members of the council shall serve at the pleasure of the Chief Financial Officer. The board shall designate one member as chair. The board shall meet at the call of the chair or the Chief Financial Officer. All members shall be appointed for a term of 4 years and shall serve until their successors are appointed. A vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term.
  - (4) MEETINGS; PROCEDURES; RECORDS; COMPENSATION. --
- (a) The business of the council shall be presented to the council in the form of an agenda. The agenda shall be set by the Chief Financial Officer and shall include items of business requested by the council members.
- (b) A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum, and action by a majority of a quorum shall be official.
- (c) The council shall make a report of each meeting to the Chief Financial Officer, which report shall show the names of the members present and shall include a record of the council's discussions, recommendations, and actions taken. The Chief Financial Officer shall keep the records of the proceedings of each meeting on file and shall make the records available to any interested person or group.
- (d) Each council member shall be entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses pursuant to s. 112.061.
  - (5) POWERS AND DUTIES.--
- (a) The council shall continually study financial problems that plague consumers, particularly young persons, seniors,

working adults, and small businesses due to a lack of basic knowledge of financial issues.

- (b) The council shall develop written materials which shall be available to educate consumers and small businesses about basic financial issues.
- (c) The council shall establish an outreach program by which the council will provide education at meetings of affected persons or by seminars provided through the council to groups of affected persons.
  - (6) RESOURCES.--

- (a) The council may apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts, and services from the state, the government of the United States or any of its agencies, or any other public or private source for the purpose of defraying clerical and administrative costs as may be necessary in carrying out its duties under this section.
- (b) The council shall secure staff assistance and use clerical resources, materials, and other support services of the Department of Financial Services and other state agencies and coordinate and consult with existing legislative staff, in order that minimum costs and maximum expertise be achieved.
- (c) The council shall use the talents, expertise, and resources within the state, and especially those of the university system, to whatever extent practicable.
- (d) The council may procure information and assistance from the state or any subdivision, municipal corporation, public officer, governmental department, or agency thereof. All agencies, officers, and political subdivisions of the state or

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- (7) REPORTS.--Beginning January 1, 2007, the council shall report annually on January 1 to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate on the activities carried out under the provisions of this section.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
