16	(i) "Substantially limits" means renders the

18	average person in the general population. Factors to consider
19	in determining whether an impairment substantially limits a
20	major life activity include the nature and severity of the
21	impairment, how long it will last or is expected to last, and
22	its permanent or long-term impact or expected impact.
