14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

16	Section 1. Section 1011.96, Florida Statutes, is created
17	to read:
18	1011.96 University growth funding
19	(1) To meet the critical workforce needs of Florida and to
20	maximize the number of diplomas, certificates, and degrees that
21	are awarded to postsecondary education students in fields vital
22	to the citizens of the state, beginning with the 2006-2007
23	fiscal year, all future enrollment growth funds for state
24	universities, community colleges, and postsecondary workforce
25	education programs shall be appropriated by the Legislature to
26	the Department of Education or to an appropriate trust fund
27	administered by the department to be distributed according to
28	the provisions of this section.

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29 (2) The department shall develop and issue a request for 30 proposals. In response to the request for proposals: 31 (a) A proposal may be made by an accredited public or 32 nonpublic postsecondary educational institution in the state 33 that provides postsecondary instruction in a field specified in 34 the priority list established pursuant to subsection (3). A proposal must indicate the number of postsecondary 35 (b) diplomas, certificates, or degrees that the institution will 36 37 award using funds received pursuant to this section and the fields in which the diplomas, certificates, or degrees will be 38 39 awarded. (c) A proposal must indicate how the funds received will 40 41 leverage other grants and scholarships and how the funds will be 42 used to offset student tuition costs. 43 (3) By March 1 of each year, the chair of Workforce 44 Florida, Inc., shall advise the Legislature of the state's most 45 pressing workforce needs for postsecondary instruction and the geographic locations of these needs. The Legislature shall 46 47 annually establish a priority list for funds provided pursuant 48 to this section in the General Appropriations Act. 49 (4) The rankings and decisions of the request-for-50 proposals process shall be made by a committee based on the 51 priority list established pursuant to subsection (3). The 52 committee shall be composed of nine members appointed by the 53 Governor, none of whom may be elected officials. The members 54 shall serve staggered 4-year terms. In order to achieve 55 staggered terms, of the initial appointments, three members

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- 57 terms, and three members shall serve 4-year terms.
- 58 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.

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
