An act relating to educational facilities; creating s. 1013.381, F.S.; requiring each district school board to adopt and implement an indoor environmental quality policy which provides for periodic surveys; providing that the policy may include certain requirements; providing for indemnification under certain circumstances; requiring notice of indoor environmental quality training completion; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt rules; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 1013.381, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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1013.381 Indoor environmental quality.--

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(1) Each district school board shall adopt and implement an indoor environmental quality policy which shall provide

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procedures for periodic surveys of indoor environmental quality
issues. The policy may:

- (a) Be developed and implemented in accordance with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Indoor Air Quality Tools for Schools Program through which training and materials shall be provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency at no cost to a school or school district.
- (b) Require that the school district provide, monitor, and maintain indoor environmental condition performance in accordance with American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) Standard 62.
- (c) Require that educational facilities be certified every 2 years by a professional engineer as meeting ASHRAE Standard 62. Upon certification, the school district shall be indemnified for the life of the certificate from liability related to indoor environmental quality. A school district shall provide a copy of the engineer's certification to the Commissioner of Education.
- (2) Each school participating in the Indoor Air Quality

 Tools for Schools Program training must display its certificate
 of completion in a conspicuous manner.
- (3) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
