Section 461.014, Florida Statutes, is 15 amended to read: 16 17 461.014 Residency.--(1) The board shall encourage and develop podiatric 18 residency programs in hospitals in this state and shall 19 20 establish such programs by the adoption promulgation of rules, 21 subject to the following conditions: 22 (a) (1) Any residency program shall be approved by the 23 Council of Podiatry Education of the American Podiatry Association. 2.4 (b)(2) A residency program may be established only at 25 26 a hospital where a duly licensed podiatric physician is on the 27 hospital staff or is otherwise in a supervisory position. 2.8 (c) (3) Every resident shall register with the board through the submission of forms provided by the board, which 29 forms shall, besides other required information, reflect the 30 date of commencement of residency. 31

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1 (d) (d) (4) Every hospital having a residency program shall 2 annually, on semiannually, on January 1 and July 1 of each year, provide the board with a list of podiatric residents and 3 such other information as is required by the board. 4 5 (e)(5) A No program in residency may not shall allow a б resident to continue as an such, unlicensed resident, for an 7 aggregate period of time in excess of 2 years. 8 (f) A person registered as a resident podiatric physician under this section may, in the normal course of his 9 10 or her employment, prescribe medicinal drugs described in schedules set forth in chapter 893 if: 11 12 The person prescribes such medicinal drugs through 1. 13 use of a Drug Enforcement Administration number issued to the hospital or teaching hospital by which the person is employed 14 or at which the person's services are used; 15 The person is identified by a discrete suffix to 16 2. 17 the identification number issued to such hospital; and 18 3. The use of the institutional identification number and individual suffixes conforms to the requirements of the 19 federal Drug Enforcement Administration. 20 21 (2) Any person who willfully violates this section 2.2 commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as 23 provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
