(2) The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission shall regulate commercial parasailing by requiring, at a minimum, that each person who provides commercial parasailing to another person be licensed and maintain the minimum liability insurance

necessary for commercial parasailing. In order to recover the costs of regulating commercial parasailing, the commission may impose by rule an annual licensing fee, which may not exceed \$100, and a registration fee of \$10 for each county in which a licensee intends to engage in commercial parasailing. The commission shall establish by rule the requirements for minimum liability insurance, including maximum deductible amounts. The commission may adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer this section.

- (3) Each person who engages in commercial parasailing must meet the following operation requirements:
- (a) Each vessel engaged in commercial parasailing operations must be designed and equipped for towing a person while parasailing and must be equipped with a rear launch platform and powered winch that is used to release and retrieve the tow line.
- (b) Any person who operates a vessel used for commercial parasailing must maintain a valid license for carrying passengers for hire issued by the United States Coast Guard.
- (c) An observer who is 18 years of age or older must, at all times, be present in any vessel that is engaged in commercial parasailing to monitor the progress of each airborne parasail rider and parachute.
- (d) Each commercial parasail rider must wear a United

 States Coast Guard approved type I, type II, or type III

 personal flotation device of the proper size and must be

 connected to the towline and secured in a seat harness attached

 to an ascending type of parachute.

(e) Commercial parasailing in the Atlantic Ocean and the Gulf of Mexico is restricted to areas that are on or above waters that are not less than three-eighths of a nautical mile seaward from the shore. This restriction applies to the entire commercial parasailing apparatus, including the vessel, towline, and rider.

- (f) Commercial parasailing may not be conducted within 600
 feet of any:
 - 1. Anchored vessel;

- 2. Person in the water;
- 3. Shore or seawall; or
- 4. Structure, bridge, power line, wharf, pier, dock, buoy, platform, piling, channel marker, or other similar object.
- (g) A person may not engage in commercial parasailing on a body of water less than 1,200 feet in width from shore to shore.
- (h) Each vessel engaged in commercial parasailing must be equipped with a functional VHF marine transceiver.
- (i) A person may not engage in commercial parasailing at any time between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise or during any period when visibility is restricted.
- (j) A person may not engage in commercial parasailing in any area where there are sustained winds of 20 knots or seas 5 feet or higher.
 - (k) A towline may not be longer than 800 feet.
- (1) A commercial parasail rider may be launched only from the flight deck of the vessel.
 - (m) More than two persons may not be tethered to the
