1 A bill to be entitled

An act relating to property appraiser assessments; amending s. 193.023, F.S.; requiring property appraisers to physically inspect property every 5 years for certain purposes; amending s. 193.501, F.S.; revising a definition; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 193.023, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

12 193.023 Duties of the property appraiser in making assessments.--

(2) In making his or her assessment of the value of real property, the property appraiser is required to inspect physically the property every 5 + 3 years to ensure that the tax roll meets all the requirements of law. However, the property appraiser shall physically inspect any parcel of taxable real property upon the request of the taxpayer or owner.

Section 2. Paragraph (g) of subsection (6) of section 193.501, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

193.501 Assessment of lands subject to a conservation easement, environmentally endangered lands, or lands used for outdoor recreational or park purposes when land development rights have been conveyed or conservation restrictions have been covenanted.--

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(6) The following terms whenever used as referred to in this section have the following meanings unless a different meaning is clearly indicated by the context:

- (g) "Outdoor recreational or park purposes" includes, but is not necessarily limited to, boating, golfing, camping, swimming, horseback riding, and archaeological, scenic, or scientific sites and applies only to land which is open to the general public. "Open to the general public," as applied to a golf course, means that the golf course is open for the property's normal use to any person who pays the daily access fee. The daily access fee may not exceed the lowest fee charged to any person.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
