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30	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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Section 1. Section 456.062, Florida Statutes, is 2 amended to read: 3 456.062 Advertisement by a health care practitioner of 4 free or discounted services; required statement. -- In any advertisement for a free, discounted fee, or reduced fee 5 service, examination, or treatment by a health care practitioner licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 8 460, chapter 461, chapter 462, chapter 463, chapter 464, 9 chapter 465, chapter 466, chapter 467, chapter 478, chapter 483, part I of chapter 484, chapter 486, chapter 490, or 10 chapter 491, the following statement shall appear in capital 11 12 letters clearly distinguishable from the rest of the text: 13 THE PATIENT AND ANY OTHER PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR PAYMENT HAS A RIGHT TO REFUSE TO PAY, CANCEL PAYMENT, OR BE REIMBURSED FOR 14 PAYMENT FOR ANY OTHER SERVICE, EXAMINATION, OR TREATMENT THAT 15 IS PERFORMED AS A RESULT OF AND WITHIN 72 HOURS OF RESPONDING 16 TO THE ADVERTISEMENT FOR THE FREE, DISCOUNTED FEE, OR REDUCED 18 FEE SERVICE, EXAMINATION, OR TREATMENT. However, the required statement shall not be necessary as an accompaniment to an 19 advertisement of a licensed health care practitioner defined 20 by this section if the advertisement appears in a classified 2.1 22 directory the primary purpose of which is to provide products 23 and services at free, reduced, or discounted prices to consumers and in which the statement prominently appears in at 2.4 25 least one place. Section 468.1155, Florida Statutes, is 26 27 amended to read: 2.8 468.1155 Provisional license; requirements.--29 (1)(a) A provisional license is shall be required of 30 all applicants who cannot document the required 9 months of 31

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supervised professional employment experience <u>as required by</u> the board and a passing score on the national examination.

- (b) Individuals who are required to hold a provisional license under paragraph (a) shall apply to the department and be certified by the board for licensure prior to initiating the professional employment experience required pursuant to s. 468.1165.
- (2) The department shall issue a provisional license to practice speech-language pathology to each applicant who the board certifies has:
- (a) Completed the application form and remitted the required fees, including a nonrefundable application fee.
- (b) Received a master's degree or <u>has completed the</u> academic requirement of is currently enrolled in a doctoral degree program with a major emphasis in speech-language pathology from an institution of higher learning that which is, or at the time the applicant was enrolled and graduated was, accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education or its successor organization Council for Higher Education Accreditation or from an institution that which is a member in good standing with the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada. An applicant who graduated from or is currently enrolled in a program at a university or college outside the United States or Canada must present documentation of the determination of equivalency to standards established by the <u>United States</u> Department of Education or its successor organization Council for Higher Education Accreditation in order to qualify. The applicant must have completed the academic and clinical requirements as established by rule of the board. The board may waive the requirements for education, practicum, and

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professional employment experience for an applicant who received a professional education in another country if the board is satisfied that the applicant meets the equivalent education and practicum requirements, passes the examination in speech-language pathology, and meets other requirements established by rule of the board. 60 semester hours that include:

1. Fundamental information applicable to the normal development and use of speech, hearing, and language; information about training in management of speech, hearing, and language disorders; and information supplementary to these fields.

2. Six semester hours in audiology.

3. Thirty of the required 60 semester hours in courses acceptable toward a graduate degree by the college or university in which these courses were taken, of which 24 semester hours must be in speech language pathology.

(c) Completed 300 supervised clinical clock hours with 200 clock hours in the area of speech language pathology or completed the number of clock hours required by an accredited institution meeting national certification standards. The supervised clinical clock hours shall be completed within the training institution or one of its cooperating programs.

- (3) The department shall issue a provisional license to practice audiology to each applicant who the board certifies has:
- (a) Completed the application form and remitted the required fees, including a nonrefundable application fee.
- (b) Effective January 1, 2007, earned a doctoral

  degree in audiology Received a master's degree or has

  completed the academic requirement of is currently enrolled in

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- (1) The department shall license any applicant whom the board certifies is qualified to practice speech-language pathology or audiology and who has paid the initial licensure fee.
- The board shall certify for licensure any (2) applicant who has:
- (a) Satisfied the education and supervised clinical clock hour requirements of s. 468.1155.
- (b) Satisfied the professional experience requirement of s. 468.1165.
- (c) Passed the licensure examination required by s. 11 12 468.1175.
  - (3) The board shall certify as qualified for a license by endorsement as a speech-language pathologist or audiologist an applicant who:
  - (a) Holds a valid license or certificate in another state or territory of the United States to practice the profession for which the application for licensure is made, if the criteria for issuance of such license were substantially equivalent to or more stringent than the licensure criteria which existed in this state at the time the license was issued; or
  - Holds a valid certificate that meets or exceeds the licensure requirements in this state as determined by rule of the board Has received the certificate of clinical competence of the American Speech Language and Hearing Association.
- (4) The board may refuse to certify any applicant who is under investigation in any jurisdiction for an act which 29 would constitute a violation of this part or chapter 456 until

the investigation is complete and disciplinary proceedings have been terminated.

- (5) An applicant for licensure or provisional licensure must demonstrate good moral character The board may refuse to certify any applicant who has violated any of the provisions of s. 468.1245.

- (1) The department shall issue a certificate as a speech-language pathology assistant to each applicant who the board certifies has:
- (a) Completed the application form and remitted the required fees, including a nonrefundable application fee.
- (b) Completed the minimum requirements for education and on-the-job training adopted by rule of the board Earned a bachelor's degree from a college or university accredited by a regional association of colleges and schools recognized by the Department of Education which includes at least 24 semester hours of coursework as approved by the board at an institution accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation.
- (2) The department shall issue a certificate as an audiology assistant to each applicant who the board certifies has:
- (a) Completed the application form and remitted the required fees, including a nonrefundable application fee.
- (b) <u>Completed the minimum requirements for education</u>

  and on-the-job training adopted by rule of the board <del>Completed</del>

  at least 24 semester hours of coursework as approved by the
