Section 468.1155, Florida Statutes, is 7 amended to read: 8 468.1155 Provisional license; requirements.--9 (1)(a) A provisional license shall be required of all applicants for a license in speech-language pathology who 10 cannot document a minimum of 9 months of supervised 11 12 professional employment experience and a passing score on the national examination. - (a) Completed the application form and remitted the required fees, including a nonrefundable application fee.
- (b) Effective January 1, 2007, earned a doctoral degree in audiology, but has not passed the license examination required for a license in audiology or has completed the academic requirements of Received a master's degree or is currently enrolled in a doctoral degree program with a major emphasis in audiology from an institution of higher learning that which is, or at the time the applicant was enrolled and graduated was, accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation or its successor or the United States Department of Education, or from an institution that which is a member in good standing with the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada.
