A bill to be entitled

An act relating to police dogs, fire dogs, SAR dogs, and police horses; amending s. 843.19, F.S.; prohibiting intentionally and knowingly causing great bodily harm to or using a deadly weapon upon a police dog, fire dog, SAR dog, or police horse; prohibiting actually and intentionally maliciously touching, striking, or causing bodily harm to a police dog, fire dog, SAR dog, or police horse; prohibiting maliciously harassing, teasing, interfering with, or attempting to interfere with a police dog, fire dog, SAR dog, or police horse while the animal is in the performance of its duties; providing penalties; providing for restitution from violators; providing application; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 843.19, Florida Statutes, is amended, and subsections (3), (4), and (5) are added to said section, to read:
- 843.19 <u>Offenses against Injuring or killing police dogs</u> dog, fire dogs dog, SAR dogs dog, or police horses horse prohibited; penalty.--
- (2) Any person who <u>intentionally and</u> knowingly <u>causes</u> and <u>willfully and without lawful cause or justification inflicts</u>

  great bodily harm, permanent disability, or death <u>to</u>, or uses a deadly weapon upon, a police dog, fire dog, SAR dog, or police

horse commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

- (3) Any person who actually and intentionally maliciously touches, strikes, or causes bodily harm to a police dog, fire dog, SAR dog, or police horse commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
- (4) Any person who intentionally or knowingly maliciously harasses, teases, interferes with, or attempts to interfere with a police dog, fire dog, SAR dog, or police horse while the animal is in the performance of its duties commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
- (5) A person convicted of an offense under this section shall make restitution for injuries caused to the police dog, fire dog, SAR dog, or police horse and shall pay the replacement cost of the animal if, as a result of the offense, the animal can no longer perform its duties.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005, and shall apply to offenses occurring on or after that date.
