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14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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16	Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida
17	Statutes, is amended to read:

19	(2) CRITERIAA member, to be designated as a special
20	risk member, must meet the following criteria:
21	(a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement
22	officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in
23	compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected
24	police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification
25	requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's
26	duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit,
27	apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law
28	violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb
29	disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location,
30	handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member
31	must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or
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1 members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, 2 administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in 3 accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 4 included; 5 б (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and 7 be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with 8 s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of 9 a local government employer or an agency of state government with firefighting responsibilities. In addition, the member's 10 duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting 11 12 of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct 13 supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance 14 performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the 15 Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and 16 17 Consumer Services; or the member must be the supervisor or 18 command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support 19 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 20 21 duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, 22 legal, and personnel, shall not be included and further 23 provided that all periods of creditable service in fire prevention or firefighter training, or as the supervisor or 2.4 command officer of a member or members who have such 25 26 responsibilities, and for which the employer paid the special 27 risk contribution rate, shall be included; 2.8 (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 29 compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's 30 primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and 31

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1 physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates 2 within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being 3 transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command 4 officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; 5 6 provided, however, administrative support personnel, 7 including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and 8 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, wardens and 9 assistant wardens, as defined by rule, shall participate in 10 the Special Risk Class; 11 12 (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance 13 Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified 14 in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's 15 16 primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene 17 emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency 18 medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have 19 such responsibility. However, administrative support 20 21 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 22 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 23 personnel, shall not be included; (e) The member must be employed as a community-based 2.4 correctional probation officer and be certified, or required 25 to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, 26 27 the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the 2.8 supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or 29 community controllees within the community; or the member must 30 be the supervisor of a member or members who have such 31

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1 responsibilities. Administrative support personnel, including, 2 but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal 3 services, and personnel management, shall not be included; 4 however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit 5 6 administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class; or 7 (f) The member must be employed in one of the 8 following classes and must spend at least 75 percent of his or her time performing duties which involve contact with patients 9 10 or inmates in a correctional or forensic facility or institution: 11 12 1. Dietitian (class codes 5203 and 5204);-13 2. Public health nutrition consultant (class code 5224);. 14 3. Psychological specialist (class codes 5230 and 15 16 5231);. 17 4. In addition, the member's primary 20 21 duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, 22 surveillance, control, investigation, apprehension, arrest, 23 and counseling of assigned juveniles within the community; or-(h) The member must be employed by a law enforcement 2.4 25 agency or medical examiner's office in a forensic discipline recognized by the International Association for Identification 26 27 and must qualify for active membership in the International 28 Association for Identification. The member's primary duties and responsibilities must include the collection, examination, 29 preservation, documentation, preparation, or analysis of 30 physical evidence or testimony, or both, or the member must be 31

1 the direct supervisor, quality management supervisor, or 2 command officer of one or more individuals with such responsibility. Administrative support personnel, including, 3 4 but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are clerical or in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, 5 6 shall not be included. 7 Section 2. The Legislature finds that a proper and 8 legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees of the state and its political subdivisions, and the 9 10 dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and retirees, are extended the basic protections afforded by 11 12 governmental retirement systems. These persons must be 13 provided benefits that are fair and adequate and that are managed, administered, and funded in a sound actuarial manner, 14 as required by Section 14, Article X of the State Constitution 15 and part VII of chapter 112, Florida Statutes. Therefore, the 16 17 Legislature hereby determines and declares that this act 18 fulfills an important state interest. Section 3. There is appropriated \$1,400,000 from the 19 General Revenue Fund on a recurring basis to the Department of 2.0 21 Law Enforcement to fund the department's costs associated with 2.2 the retirement benefits granted by this act, effective October 23 1, 2005. Section 4.
