19	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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21	Section 1. Section 335.065, Florida Statutes, is amended
22	to read:
23	335.065 Bicycle and pedestrian ways along state roads and
24	transportation facilities
25	(1)(a) Bicycle and pedestrian ways shall be incorporated
26	into given full consideration in the planning and development of
27	transportation facilities, including the incorporation of such
28	ways into state, regional, and local transportation plans and

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29 programs. Bicycle and pedestrian ways shall be established in 30 conjunction with the construction, reconstruction, or other 31 change of any state transportation facility, and special 32 emphasis shall be given to projects in or within 1 mile of an urban area. Except as provided in paragraph (b), bicycle lanes 33 34 shall be established if there is sufficient right-of-way 35 whenever there is construction, reconstruction, or other change 36 of any state transportation facility. 37 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a), 38 bicycle and pedestrian ways are not required to be established: Where their establishment would be contrary to public 39 1. 40 safety; 2. When the cost would be excessively disproportionate to 41 42 the need or probable use; Where other available means or factors indicate an 43 3. 44 absence of need. 45 The department shall establish construction standards (2) and a uniform system of signing for bicycle and pedestrian ways. 46 47 Standard shoulders of a minimum of 5 feet in width are required 48 where right-of-way exists. This criteria is set forth in the 49 Plans Preparation Manual. 50 The department, in cooperation with the Department of (3) Environmental Protection, shall establish a statewide integrated 51 52 system of bicycle and pedestrian ways in such a manner as to 53 take full advantage of any such ways which are maintained by any 54 governmental entity. For the purposes of this section, bicycle 55 facilities may be established as part of or separate from the

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56 actual roadway and may utilize existing road rights-of-way or 57 other rights-of-way or easements acquired for public use.

58 Section 2. Section 335.066, Florida Statutes, is amended 59 to read:

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335.066 Safe Paths to Schools Program.--

(1) There is established in the Department of
Transportation the Safe Paths to Schools Program to <u>facilitate</u>
consider the planning and construction of bicycle and pedestrian
ways to provide safe transportation for children from
neighborhoods to schools, parks, and the state's greenways and
trails system.

67 (2) As a part of the Safe Paths to Schools Program, the
68 department <u>shall may</u> establish a grant program to fund local,
69 regional, and state bicycle and pedestrian projects that support
70 the program.

(3) The department may adopt appropriate rules pursuant to
ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 for the administration of the Safe
Paths to Schools Program.

74 Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 335.093, Florida75 Statutes, is amended to read:

76 335.093 Scenic highway designation.--

(2)(a) The department may by rule adopt appropriate
criteria for the designation of scenic highways and may specify
appropriate planning and design standards, including corridor
management plans on such scenic highways.

(b) The Legislature recognizes that scenic roads and
 corridors are primary bicycle and pedestrian routes. Planning
 and design standards under paragraph (a) must provide for
