An act relating to the Department of Citrus; amending s. 601.04, F.S., relating to the membership of the Florida Citrus Commission; conforming provisions to changes made by the act; amending s. 601.09, F.S.; revising and reorganizing the citrus districts of the state; establishing four such districts; specifying the counties within each district; amending s. 601.154, F.S.; conforming provisions to changes made by the act; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) and subsection (4) of section 601.04, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

membership.-(1)

(c) There shall be three four members of the commission from each of the four three citrus districts. Each member must reside in the district from which she or he was appointed. For the purposes of this section, the residence of a member shall be the actual physical and permanent residence of the member.

(4) It is the intent of the Legislature that the commission be redistricted every 5 years. Redistricting shall be based on the total boxes produced from each of the <u>four</u> three districts during that 5-year period.
