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Senator Clary moved the following amendment:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

On page 6, between lines 18 and 19,

insert:

Section 4. (1) A licensee that has failed to renew its ambulatory surgical center license may meet the requirements of the Florida Building Code which were in effect at the time of its original licensure for the purposes of an initial application if:

(a) The license expired between July 1, 2004 and December 31, 2004.

(b) The initial license application was filed within 30 days after the license expired.

(c) The ambulatory surgical center is in compliance with regulatory requirements based upon agency inspection.

(2) This section applies only to the initial application for licensure and does not circumvent any requirement to meet current Florida Building Code requirements or other modifications.

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(Redesignate subsequent sections.)

 areas; providing for membership, reimbursement,
 and duties of the study commission; requiring
 the Department of Community Affairs to provide
 staff for the study commission; requiring the
 commission to submit a report and
 recommendations to the Governor and the
 Legislature; creating a health insurance plan
 study group; specifying membership; requiring
 the study group to investigate certain issues
 relating to health insurance plans; requiring
 the group to meet and submit recommendations to
 the Governor and the Legislature; directing the
 Office of Program Policy Analysis and
 Government Accountability to conduct a study to
 evaluate whether the State of Florida should
 join the Nurse Licensure Compact; allowing an
