32	(1)(a) The Fire and Emergency Incident Information
33	Reporting Program is created within the Division of State Fire
34	Marshal. The program shall:
35	1. Establish and maintain an electronic communication
36	system capable of transmitting fire and emergency incident
37	information to and between fire protection agencies.
38	2. Initiate a Fire and Emergency Incident Information
39	Reporting System that shall be responsible for:
40	a. Receiving fire and emergency incident information from
41	fire protection agencies.
42	b. Preparing and disseminating annual reports to the
43	Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House
44	of Representatives, fire protection agencies, and, upon request,
45	the public. Each report shall include, but not be limited to,

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85 Section 2. Section 633.171, Florida Statutes, is amended 86 to read:

87 633.171 Penalty for violation of law, rule, or order to
88 cease and desist or for failure to comply with corrective
89 order.--

90 (1) <u>Any person who violates</u> The violation of any provision 91 of this law, or any order or rule of the State Fire Marshal, or 92 <u>any</u> order to cease and desist or to correct conditions issued 93 <u>under this chapter commits</u> hereunder, shall constitute a 94 misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 95 775.082 or s. 775.083.

96 (2) It <u>is shall constitute</u> a misdemeanor of the first 97 degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, to 98 intentionally or willfully:

99 (a) Render a fire extinguisher or preengineered system 100 required by statute or by rule inoperative except during such 101 time as the extinguisher or preengineered system is being 102 serviced, hydrotested, tested, repaired, or recharged, except 103 pursuant to court order.

104 (b) Obliterate the serial number on a fire extinguisher105 for purposes of falsifying service records.

106 (c) Improperly service, recharge, repair, hydrotest, test,107 or inspect a fire extinguisher or preengineered system.

(d) Use the license or permit number of another person.

109 (e) Hold a permit and allow another person to use said110 permit number.

(f) Use, or permit the use of, any license by any individual or organization other than the one to whom the

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113 license is issued.

114 (3)(a) A person who initiates a pyrotechnic display in an 115 indoor facility that does not have a fire suppression system 116 installed in compliance with s. 633.065 commits a felony of the 117 third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, 118 or s. 775.084.

(b) A person who initiates a pyrotechnic display in an indoor facility without the written consent of the owner or operator of the indoor facility and without a permit issued by the local authority having jurisdiction commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

125 (c) This subsection does not apply to the manufacture, 126 distribution, sale at wholesale or retail, or seasonal sale of 127 products regulated under chapter 791 if the products are not 128 used in an indoor facility.

Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 633.821, Florida Statutes, is amended, and subsection (6) is added to said section, to read:

633.821 Workplace safety.--

133 The division shall have the authority to adopt rules (2) for the purpose of ensuring safe working conditions for all 134 firefighter employees by authorizing the enforcement of 135 136 effective standards, by assisting and encouraging firefighter 137 employers to maintain safe working conditions, and by providing 138 for education and training in the field of safety. Specifically, 139 the division may by rule adopt all or any part of subparts C 140 through T and subpart Z of 29 C.F.R. s. 1910, as revised April

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141 8, 1998; the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., 142 Standard 1500, paragraph 5-7 (Personal Alert Safety System) 143 (1992 edition); the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., 144 Publication 1403, Standard on Live Fire Training Evolutions 145 (latest edition), as limited by subsection (6); and ANSI A 10.4-146 1990. 147 (6)(a) The division shall adopt rules for live fire 148 training that all firefighters subject to this chapter must 149 complete. The division shall also adopt rules for a training and 150 certification process for live fire training instructors. 151 (b) Such rules for training shall include: 152 1. Sections of the most current edition of the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1402, Guide to 153 154 Building Fire Service Training Centers, relating to establishing 155 policies and procedures for effective use of such permanent 156 facilities or structures. 157 2. Sections of the most current edition of the National 158 Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1403, Standard on 159 Live Fire Training Evolutions, excluding, however: 160 a. Any chapter entitled "Referenced Publications." 161 b. References to the National Fire Protection Association, 162 Inc., Publication 1975, Station Uniform. 163 The National Fire Protection Association, Inc., c. Publication 1001, or any references to such publication in the 164 165 National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1975. d. Any reference to an authority having jurisdiction in 166 167 the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., publication 168 1403, defined as the organization, office, or individual
