2 An act relating to swimming pool/spa contractors and 3 service technicians; amending s. 489.105, F.S.; revising 4 the scope of work for commercial and residential pool/spa 5 contractors and swimming pool/spa servicing contractors; removing licensure exemptions; defining and establishing 6 7 provisional licensure for swimming pool/spa servicing 8 contractors; amending s. 489.111, F.S.; removing the 1-9 year experience requirement to qualify to take the swimming pool/spa servicing contractors' examination; 10 amending s. 514.075, F.S.; revising duties of the 11 12 Department of Health; providing for public pools to be serviced by specified persons; revising certification 13 requirements for public pool service technicians; 14 providing an effective date. 15 16 17 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 18 19 Section 1. Paragraphs (j), (k), and (l) of subsection (3) 20 of section 489.105, Florida Statutes, are amended, and 21 subsection (20) is added to said section, to read: 489.105 Definitions.--As used in this part: 22 23 (3) "Contractor" means the person who is qualified for, and shall only be responsible for, the project contracted for 24 25 and means, except as exempted in this part, the person who, for 26 compensation, undertakes to, submits a bid to, or does himself 27 or herself or by others construct, repair, alter, remodel, add 28 to, demolish, subtract from, or improve any building or

29 structure, including related improvements to real estate, for 30 others or for resale to others; and whose job scope is 31 substantially similar to the job scope described in one of the 32 subsequent paragraphs of this subsection. For the purposes of regulation under this part, "demolish" applies only to 33 34 demolition of steel tanks over 50 feet in height; towers over 50 35 feet in height; other structures over 50 feet in height, other 36 than buildings or residences over three stories tall; and 37 buildings or residences over three stories tall. Contractors are 38 subdivided into two divisions, Division I, consisting of those contractors defined in paragraphs (a)-(c), and Division II, 39 40 consisting of those contractors defined in paragraphs (d)-(q):

"Commercial pool/spa contractor" means a contractor 41 (j) 42 whose scope of work involves, but is not limited to, the 43 construction, repair, and servicing of any swimming pool, or hot 44 tub or spa, whether public, private, or otherwise, regardless of 45 use. The scope of work includes the installation, repair, or replacement of existing equipment; any cleaning, or equipment 46 47 sanitizing, or use of chemicals for the purposes of water 48 treatment; which requires at least a partial disassembling, 49 excluding filter changes, and the installation of new pool/spa equipment, interior finishes, the installation of package pool 50 heaters, and the installation of all perimeter piping and filter 51 piping; - and the construction of equipment rooms or housing for 52 53 pool/spa equipment, and also includes the scope of work of a 54 swimming pool/spa servicing contractor. The scope of such work 55 does not include direct connections to a sanitary sewer system 56 or to potable water lines. The installation, construction,

57 modification, or replacement of equipment permanently attached 58 to and associated with the pool or spa for the purpose of water 59 treatment or cleaning of the pool or spa requires licensure; 60 however, the usage of such equipment for the purposes of water treatment or cleaning shall not require licensure unless the 61 usage involves construction, modification, or replacement of 62 63 such equipment. Water treatment that does not require such 64 equipment does not require a license. In addition, a license 65 shall not be required for the cleaning of the pool or spa in any 66 way that does not affect the structural integrity of the pool or 67 spa or its associated equipment.

"Residential pool/spa contractor" means a contractor 68 (k) 69 whose scope of work involves, but is not limited to, the 70 construction, repair, and servicing of any residential swimming 71 pool, or hot tub or spa, regardless of use. The scope of work 72 includes the installation, repair, or replacement of existing 73 equipment; τ any cleaning, or equipment sanitizing, or use of 74 chemicals for the purposes of water treatment; which requires at 75 least a partial disassembling, excluding filter changes, and the 76 installation of new pool/spa equipment, interior finishes, the 77 installation of package pool heaters, and the installation of all perimeter piping and filter piping; - and the construction of 78 79 equipment rooms or housing for pool/spa equipment, and also 80 includes the scope of work of a swimming pool/spa servicing 81 contractor. The scope of such work does not include direct 82 connections to a sanitary sewer system or to potable water 83 lines. The installation, construction, modification, or 84 replacement of equipment permanently attached to and associated

85 with the pool or spa for the purpose of water treatment or 86 cleaning of the pool or spa requires licensure; however, the 87 usage of such equipment for the purposes of water treatment or 88 cleaning shall not require licensure unless the usage involves 89 construction, modification, or replacement of such equipment. 90 Water treatment that does not require such equipment does not 91 require a license. In addition, a license shall not be required 92 for the cleaning of the pool or spa in any way that does not 93 affect the structural integrity of the pool or spa or its 94 associated equipment.

"Swimming pool/spa servicing contractor" means a 95 (1)96 contractor whose scope of work involves, but is not limited to, the repair and servicing of any swimming pool, or hot tub or 97 98 spa, whether public, or private, or otherwise, regardless of 99 use. The scope of work includes the repair or replacement of 100 existing equipment; - any cleaning, or equipment sanitizing, or 101 use of chemicals for the purposes of water treatment; which 102 requires at least a partial disassembling, excluding filter 103 changes, and the installation of new pool/spa equipment; interior refinishing; τ the reinstallation or addition of pool 104 105 heaters; τ the repair or replacement of all perimeter piping and filter piping; - the repair of equipment rooms or housing for 106 pool/spa equipment; τ and the substantial or complete draining of 107 108 a swimming pool, or hot tub or spa, for the purpose of any 109 repair or renovation. The scope of such work does not include 110 direct connections to a sanitary sewer system or to potable 111 water lines. The installation, construction, modification, substantial or complete disassembly, or replacement of equipment 112

113 permanently attached to and associated with the pool or spa for 114 the purpose of water treatment or cleaning of the pool or spa 115 requires licensure; however, the usage of such equipment for the 116 purposes of water treatment or cleaning shall not require 117 licensure unless the usage involves construction, modification, 118 substantial or complete disassembly, or replacement of such 119 equipment. Water treatment that does not require such equipment 120 does not require a license. In addition, a license shall not be 121 required for the cleaning of the pool or spa in any way that 122 does not affect the structural integrity of the pool or spa or 123 its associated equipment. (20) "Provisional license" means a license granted to a 124 125 swimming pool/spa servicing contractor who has met all 126 qualifications for licensure but has no proven work experience 127 related to the scope of work of such a contractor. A provisional 128 license shall be effective for a period of 1 year from the date 129 of issuance, at which time a license will be granted to the 130 individual or business organization qualified by that 131 individual. During the term of provisional licensure, the 132 contractor shall be prohibited from performing any work 133 involving public swimming pools, or hot tubs or spas, interior 134 refinishing of private swimming pools, or hot tubs or spas, and 135 any draining of a private swimming pool, or hot tub or spa, for the purpose of any repair or renovation. During the term of 136 137 provisional licensure, the contractor may partially drain up to 75 percent of a private swimming pool, or hot tub or spa, for 138 139 the purposes of water treatment.

Has received a baccalaureate degree from an accredited

 architecture, or building construction and has 1 year of proven
 experience in the category in which the person seeks to qualify.
 For the purpose of this part, a minimum of 2,000 person-hours
 shall be used in determining full-time equivalency.

Has a total of at least 4 years of active experience as 153 2. 154 a worker who has learned the trade by serving an apprenticeship 155 as a skilled worker who is able to command the rate of a 156 mechanic in the particular trade or as a foreman who is in 157 charge of a group of workers and usually is responsible to a 158 superintendent or a contractor or his or her equivalent, provided, however, that at least 1 year of active experience 159 160 shall be as a foreman.

Has a combination of not less than 1 year of experience as a foreman and not less than 3 years of credits for any accredited college-level courses; has a combination of not less than 1 year of experience as a skilled worker, 1 year of experience as a foreman, and not less than 2 years of credits for any accredited college-level courses; or has a combination of not less than 2 years of experience as a skilled worker, 1

4.a. An active certified residential contractor is
eligible to take the building contractors' examination if he or
she possesses a minimum of 3 years of proven experience in the
classification in which he or she is certified.

b. An active certified residential contractor is eligible
to take the general contractors' examination if he or she
possesses a minimum of 4 years of proven experience in the
classification in which he or she is certified.

c. An active certified building contractor is eligible to
take the general contractors' examination if he or she possesses
a minimum of 4 years of proven experience in the classification
in which he or she is certified.

199 6.a. An active certified swimming pool servicing 200 contractor is eligible to take the residential swimming pool 201 contractors' examination if he or she possesses a minimum of 3 202 years of proven experience in the classification in which he or 203 she is certified.

b. An active certified swimming pool servicing contractor is eligible to take the swimming pool commercial contractors' examination if he or she possesses a minimum of 4 years of proven experience in the classification in which he or she is certified.

209 c. An active certified residential swimming pool 210 contractor is eligible to take the commercial swimming pool 211 contractors' examination if he or she possesses a minimum of 1 212 year of proven experience in the classification in which he or 213 she is certified.

d. An applicant is eligible to take the swimming pool/spa
servicing contractors' examination if he or she has
satisfactorily completed 60 hours of instruction in courses
related to the scope of work covered by that license and
approved by the Construction Industry Licensing Board by rule
and has at least 1 year of proven experience related to the
scope of work of such a contractor.

514.075 Public pool service technician; certification. -- The department shall may require that a public pool, as defined in s. 514.011, be serviced by a person licensed under s. 489.105(3)(j), (k), or (l); a person permitted as a public pool operator under s. 514.031; or a person who is certified as a pool service technician and who is the direct employee of a person permitted as a public pool operator under s. 514.031. To be certified, an individual must demonstrate knowledge of public pools which includes, but is not limited to: pool cleaning; general pool maintenance; pool safety codes; source of the water supply; bacteriological, chemical, and physical quality of water; and water purification, testing, treatment, and disinfection procedures. The department may, by rule, establish the requirement for the certification course and course approval. The department shall deem certified any individual who is certified by a course of national recognition such as the Certified Pool Operator certification from the National Swimming Pool Foundation or any person licensed under s. 489.105(3)(j), (k), or (1). This requirement does not apply to a person, or the direct employee of a person, permitted as a public pool operator under s. 514.031.
