This section is intended to explicitly supersede only the first sentence of subsection (3) of section 109, chapter 2000-30 141, Laws of Florida. 31 32 Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, the option for designing for internal pressure for 33 buildings within the windborne debris region shall be repealed 34 immediately upon adoption of standards and conditions within the 35 36 International Building Code or International Residential Code prohibiting such design option. The Florida Building Commission 37 shall initiate rulemaking to incorporate such standards and 38 39 conditions prohibiting designing for internal pressure for 40 buildings into the Florida Building Code when the base code is 41 updated. 42 Section 3. For fiscal year 2005-2006 only, the sum of \$200,000 is appropriated from the Insurance Regulatory Trust 43 44 Fund to the Department of Financial Services to be used to 45 develop a joint program between the Florida Insurance Council and the Florida Home Builders Association to educate contractors 46 on the benefits and options available for designing buildings 47 for windborne debris protection and to develop a standardized 48 49 affidavit to be used for verifying the insurance discounts for 50 residential construction techniques demonstrated to reduce the 51 amount of loss during a windstorm. 52 Section 4.
