25	or certification pursuant to s. $489.105(3)(a)-(i)$ or $(m)-(o)$ may
26	perform specialty contracting services for the construction,

29 professional license if such person is supervised by a certified 30 or registered commercial pool/spa contractor, residential 31 pool/spa contractor, or swimming pool/spa servicing contractor 32 acting within the scope of the supervising contractor's license. 33 A local authority that does not require a local specialty 34 contractor license or local certificate of competency for any 35 service provided by a certified or registered commercial pool/spa contractor, residential pool/spa contractor, or 36 37 swimming pool/spa servicing contractor must allow, as an 38 alternative to the local license or certificate, local 39 registration of the person contracting with a supervising contractor to perform a specialty service under this paragraph. 40 41 The local authority may charge a fee for local registration 42 which does not exceed \$150.
