HB 879 2005

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to public school educational instruction; creating s. 1003.457, F.S.; providing legislative intent; providing district school board responsibility for developing a fine and performing arts program and assessing students with respect to knowledge and skills obtained; requiring a written policy relating to time and access to the program; requiring annual reports; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, the educational program for Florida's children shall consist of a fully developed curriculum, allowing students time and access to a wide variety of curriculum choices, and

WHEREAS, the curriculum for Florida's students is defined by the Sunshine State Standards, and

WHEREAS, American culture is significantly taught through the fine and performing arts, and

WHEREAS, fine and performing arts classes have an impact on the academic success and individual achievement of students in the public schools, and

WHEREAS, the arts are designated as part of the core curriculum in the federal No Child Left Behind Act, NoW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1003.457, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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1003.457 Fine and performing arts; assessment.--

- (1) Recognizing the importance of maintaining a balanced, well-rounded curriculum for Florida's students and the contributions of a fine and performing arts program to the academic success of students, it is the intent of the Legislature to ensure that such elective program remains strong and accessible in the school day.
- (2) It is the responsibility of each district school board to develop a fine and performing arts program that addresses the state's rich cultural diversity and promotes creative thinking and problem solving. Students must be allowed sufficient time and access to instruction to acquire fine and performing arts knowledge and skills which shall be defined by and assessed according to the Sunshine State Standards.
- (3) Each district school board shall adopt a written policy for providing time and access to the fine and performing arts program for students in prekindergarten through grade 12 and shall provide a copy of the policy to the Department of Education by January 1, 2006.
- (4) Each district school board shall report annually to the department on prekindergarten through grade 12 student achievement and trends in the fine and performing arts. The department shall summarize the reports and disseminate the summary to each district school board.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
