15	Section 1. Section 381.0402, Florida Statutes, is amended

18	(1) The department, in cooperation with state the state-
19	approved medical schools approved to form an area health
20	education center network in this state, shall maintain and
21	evaluate organize an area health education center network
22	focused based on earlier medically indigent demonstration
23	projects and shall evaluate the impact of each network on
24	improving access to services by persons who are medically
25	underserved. The network shall <u>serve as</u> be a catalyst for the
26	primary care training of health professionals by increasing
27	<u>training</u> through increased opportunities for training in
28	medically underserved areas, increasing access to primary care

33	medical schools to assist in funding the an area health
34	education center network which links the provision of primary

36	persons with the education of <u>:</u>
37	(a) Medical students, interns, and residents. The network

40	approved medical schools, which shall be responsible for the

43	approved medical school coordinating the <u>recruitment</u> recruiting ,

46	<u>2.(d)</u> Use current community resources such as county

Use community resources such as county health 57 departments, federally funded migrant and community health 58 centers, and other primary health care providers as sites for 59 training health professions students. 60 3. Use a multidisciplinary approach with appropriate 61 supervision. 62 (c) Health providers serving medically underserved 63 populations. The network shall: 64 1. Assist providers in medically underserved areas and other safety net providers in remaining current in their fields 65 66 through a variety of community resource initiatives. 67 2. Strengthen the state's health care safety net by enhancing services and increasing access to care in medically 68 69 underserved areas. 3. Provide other services such as library and information 70 71 resources, continuing professional education, technical assistance, and other support services for providers serving in 72 73 medically underserved areas. 74 (3) (3) (2) The department shall establish criteria and 75 procedures for quality assurance, performance evaluations, 76 periodic audits, and other appropriate safeguards for the 77 network. 78 (4) (4) (3) The department shall make every effort to assure 79 that the network does participating medical schools do not discriminate among enrollees with respect to age, race, sex, or 80 health status. However, the network such schools may target 81 82 high-risk medically needy population groups.
