A resolution honoring the memory of Judge Henry Latimer.

WHEREAS, Henry Latimer was born in Ocilla, Georgia, on January 22, 1938, grew up in Jacksonville, Florida, and went on to earn his undergraduate degree from Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University in 1963, his graduate degree from Florida Atlantic University in 1967, and his degree of Juris Doctor from the University of Miami's Law School in 1973, and

WHEREAS, in 1979, Henry Latimer was appointed by Florida Governor Bob Graham to serve as a Circuit Court Judge in Broward County, in which capacity he was regarded for his intellect and fairness and consistently received the highest rating of "most qualified" from lawyers who practiced in his courtroom, and

WHEREAS, Henry Latimer stepped down from the judgeship to return to private practice, and his giving spirit and commitment to providing legal services to the less fortunate led him to create the Laura Latimer Free Legal Clinic, in the name of his sister, through which he enlisted attorneys to provide legal clinics, and

WHEREAS, Henry Latimer, active in numerous professional associations and community service organizations and the recipient of many prestigious awards and honors, held his most recent position with the nationally prominent law firm of Greenberg Traurig, and

WHEREAS, on January 24, 2005, Henry Latimer, a devoted husband, father, grandfather, uncle, mentor, and friend, ended his service upon this earth, leaving the citizens of Florida to
