WHEREAS, he and friend Eric Douglas were thrown from their tow lines while kneeboarding in Deerfield Beach's Quiet Waters Park, and Eric Douglas was left semi-conscious in the water after being struck by another kneeboarder, and

WHEREAS, Kristopher Geyer-Roberts swam to his rescue, pulling his friend onto a kneeboard and towing him to safety, acts that resulted in his friend's full recovery, and

WHEREAS, Kristopher Geyer-Roberts was subsequently presented in 2004 with a heroism award by the Boy Scouts of America and a key to the City of Plantation by Plantation Mayor Rae Carole Armstrong, and

WHEREAS, in 2005, he was selected from more than four million Boy Scouts and was one of only six Scouts in the nation to represent his organization in Washington, D.C., where the group visited the United States Supreme Court, Arlington National Cemetery, the Goddard Space Flight Center, the Pentagon, and the United States Naval Academy and delivered the annual report of the Boy Scouts of America to President George W. Bush at the White House, NOW, THEREFORE,
